Resources on the Washington OER Hub meet the submission criteria which includes:

- Explicitly addresses Washington Learning Standards, development guidelines, or benchmarks.
- Includes clear learning objectives and goals.
- Displays accurate and relevant content.
- Supports sound teaching practice.
- Cultivates student interest and engagement.
- Provides developmentally and culturally appropriate content.
