Indicator B6

Agree with State Design Team recommendations but want to revisit in a year or two if targets are too rigorous or not rigorous enough and continue focus on increasing preschool inclusionary practices.

Summary of SEAC Vote (vote passes unanimously): SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendations for early childhood Ind 6, and prioritize efforts and collaboration to increase opportunities for students with disabilities to access inclusive preschool settings, with the rigor and achievability of the target for B6A, as well as the concerns about the access, amount, and availability of inclusive pre-k options for students with disabilities ages 3–5. In the event that the target is exceeded, SEAC would like to reexamine these targets and consider additional increases.

Indicator B7

Agree with State Design Team recommendations but want to revisit in a year or two if targets are too rigorous or not rigorous enough.

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendations for Indicators 7. In the event that the target is exceeded, SEAC would like to reexamine these targets and consider additional increases.

Agree with State Design Team recommendations

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendations for Indicator 17.

Indicator B1

Agree with State Design Team recommendations but want to revisit in a year or two if targets are too rigorous or not rigorous enough.

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendation for Indicator 1. In the event that the target is exceeded, SEAC would like to reexamine this target and consider additional increases.

Indicator B2

Agree with State Design Team recommendations

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): Based on the new calculation and feedback from the focus group, SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendation for Indicator 2.

Agree with State Design Team recommendations

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendations for Indicator B3.

Indicator B3D

Agree with State Design Team recommendations but want to revisit in a year or two if targets are too rigorous or not rigorous enough.

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends keeping the original recommendations for Indicator 3. In the event that the target is exceeded, SEAC would like to reexamine this target and consider additional increases and recognizes that students will need access and supports to meet these goals.

Indicator B5

Agree with State Design Team recommendations but want to revisit in a year or two if targets are too rigorous or not rigorous enough.

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously) Ind B5A-C SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendations, SEAC would like to reexamine this target in one year.

A member of the public in attendance recommended that OSPI look at placement data in more detail at the 80–100% group (i.e., look at the 80–90% and 90–99% placement and full inclusion separately). They requested that OSPI require school districts to report exact percentages of inclusion/placement/LRE to give data for analysis.

4. Focus Group Indicators:

Indicator B8

Agree with State Design Team recommendations but want to revisit after new survey is implemented.

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendations. Because the survey is being redesigned, the SEAC would like to revisit when they have a new tool or new data.

Agree with State Design Team recommendations

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends to keep the original recommendations for Indicator 4.

B16 – Mediation Agreements

Indicator B15

Propose new targets.

Summary of SEAC vote (passed, with one opposed): SEAC recommends to increase the targets over the six year period, with the final target set at 32.4%. Increase by .941 each year. Concern expressed by SEAC about lack of information and statistics to make informed decision, and a desire to reexamine.

Indicator B16

Propose new targets.

Summary of SEAC vote (passed unanimously): SEAC recommends to increase the targets over the six year period, starting with 81.4 the first year and with the final target set at 87.4. add 1% each year.
