### WORK-BASED LEARNING AND EXTENDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

#### Work Experience Opportunities

CTE students in many cases can pursue what is called a "work-based learning" opportunity or an internship involving a job outside of school. "Work-based learning" experiences are always paid and also earn high school credit. Internships are typically paid but do not earn academic credit. Individual schools and CTE teachers work with local employers to arrange these opportunities for their students, so your local CTE or career office is the best source of information for what your own school offers.

#### Student Leadership Organizations



HOSA is a national organization for students exploring health care careers. Students gain leadership and technical HOSA skill competencies through a program of motivation, awareness and recognition, which is an integral part of the Health Science Education instructional program. Students attend conferences and participate in competitive events and network with peers and health care industry partners.



WCTSMA is a network of professionals where students gain career and college readiness skills in sports medicine and related careers, and learn how to help others develop, grow and succeed on and off the field.
