	happening. Because of increased standards for			
	interpreters, has caused a large number of			
	interpreters to not renew their certification.			
	SB 5395 – Concerning comprehensive sexual			
	health education. Would have provided sexual			
	health to all students. The bill did not get out of			
	House Education and therefore is technically
