

Summary: Downloadable PDF includes over a dozen low or no-prep text-based activities that support English Language Arts and Economics. Students will write and draw about volunteering, illustrate story elements, write about CJ's feelings, summarize the story, respond to writing prompts, sort ending punctuation, define story vocabulary, identify figurative language, consider ways to volunteer in the community, and reflect on and respond to comprehension questions and writing prompts.
