ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Washington State Title I, Part C Migrant Education Program is federally funded to ensure high-quality education programs and supplemental support services for migratory children; including American Indian and Alaska Native students, whose treaty-protected, migratory lifeways in seasonal locations for fishing and gathering are recognized.



ELIGIBILITY

- The child is not older than 21 years of age.
- The child made a qualifying move in the preceding 36 months as a migratory agricultural worker or migratory fisher, or did so with, or to join a parent/guardian or spouse who is a migratory agricultural worker or migratory fisher.
