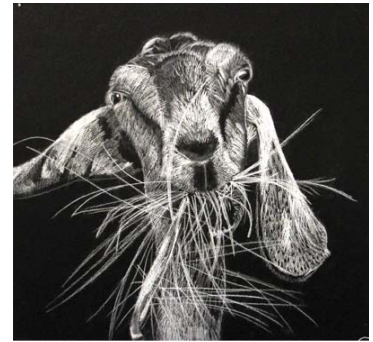

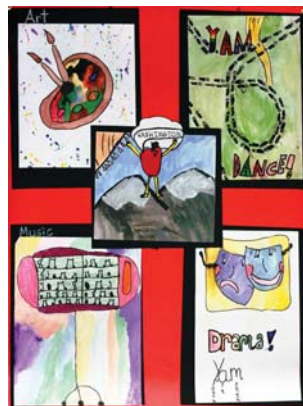

to the 38th Annual Superintendent's High School Art Show for Washington State!

History

Since 1973, we have celebrated the tradition of honoring the exceptional efforts of visual arts students and their teachers in Washington State! We are proud to continue this annual event and acknowledge and display the outstanding visual artwork by current Washington State high school students (Grades 9–12) at the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI).

Preparation for this event occurred in nine regional high school art shows held in each of the nine Educational Service Districts (ESDs) and regions, February through April 2011. One hundred and eight winning pieces were then forwarded to the state exhibit at OSPI where they were honored as Regional Winners. These Regional Winners were eligible and competed to be one of fourteen State Winners. Each winning piece will be purchased for \$200.00, framed, tagged, and become a part of the OSPI's permanent high school art collection which will now number 316 pieces. All visual arts mediums are represented in this collection. Fourteen purchase awards have been given this year. OSPI purchased seven pieces, which includes the Superintendent's Choice, OSPI Staff Choice, and five juried pieces. One piece is also purchased by each of the following education partners: State Board of Education (SBE), Professional Educator Standards Board (PESB), Washington Association of School Administrators (WASA), Washington State School Directors' Association (WSSDA), ArtsEd Washington, Association of Washington School Principals (AWSP), and the Washington Art Education Association (WAEA). The WAEA piece is selected in honor of their "Tribute Award" winner. This year's recipient is retired art teacher Carl Clausen, former employee of the Bellevue School District in K–12 visual arts positions. This award is given to outstanding arts educators, arts advocates, and businesses nominated by the WAEA membership. WAEA membership and leadership also assist in co-hosting the annual art show reception and in award presentation.

Judging Criteria

The artwork is objectively judged in three criteria without any information available to judges that will identify the artist or the artwork. All ESD Regional Winners have been screened and judged in their ESD art shows to ensure that only original artwork is forwarded to the Annual Superintendent's High School Art Show as a regional winner.

In addition to originality, the three criteria that each piece of art is judged upon include:

Creativity:

The artwork demonstrates original thinking and expressive artistic perceptions.

Composition:

The artwork demonstrates a unique and sensitive way of solving artistic problems. It illustrates student understanding of, and ability to interpret, the elements and principles of design of visual art.

Technique:

The artwork demonstrates student competency in using the medium to achieve a desired outcome.

Additionally, the artwork is judged on the student's ability to meet and demonstrate all four of Washington State's Essential Academic Learning Requirements (EALRs) in The Arts, now referred to as: The Arts Learning Standards. They are:

1. The student understands and applies arts knowledge and skills in dance, music, theatre, and visual arts.
2. The student uses the artistic processes of creating, performing/presenting, and responding to demonstrate thinking skills in dance, music, theatre, and visual arts.
3. The student communicates through the arts (dance, music, theatre, and visual arts).
4. The student makes connections within and across the arts (dance, music, theatre, and visual arts) to other disciplines, life, cultures, and work.

Arts Education Month Proclamation

Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction Proclamation for May 2011 as Arts Education Month – Outlines the State and OSPI Systemic Structure for Arts Education for All Learners in all 295 School Districts!

WHEREAS, The arts are included in the Basic Education Goals of Washington state (RCW28A.150.210). Dance, music, theatre, and visual arts are defined as the arts in Washington State;

WHEREAS, Arts Education is required for High School Graduation with one credit—WAC180-51-061; and in November 2010, the State Board of Education recommended an increase in the number of arts credits to two; and should this be supported by the State Legislature, it would apply to the class of 2016;

WHEREAS, Washington State has created arts performance standards and performance assessments to ensure that all students have quality instructional opportunities in the arts of their choice and interest;

WHEREAS, Learning done through the arts gives students crucial critical thinking and problem-solving skills, imagination, and creativity;

WHEREAS, Imagination, creativity, and innovation are understood as necessary for success in life in the 21st century;

WHEREAS, The arts can bring every academic subject to life and can enhance student engagement and extend student learning in all subjects; and

WHEREAS, The arts can transform our schools into havens of creativity and exploration places where students want to learn, teachers want to teach, and all members of the learning community are more engaged and motivated;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction reaffirms the importance of the arts as an essential part of a complete and basic education for all students; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That May 2011 is recognized by the Superintendent of Public Instruction as Arts Education Month in Washington State, and all communities are encouraged to celebrate the arts with meaningful activities and programs that demonstrate learning and understanding in the arts, and that all citizens are urged to become interested in and give full support to quality school arts programs.
