PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

The purpose of this bulletin is to provide information about a legislatively-mandated survey now available for districts and schools to provide information about how they are providing Digital Citizenship, Media Literacy, and Internet Safety education to their students. The deadline to complete the survey is May 31, 2018.

Substitute Senate Bill 5449 directed OSPI to survey teacher-librarians, principals, and technology directors in order to understand how they are currently integrating digital citizenship and media literacy education in their curriculum. The purpose of the survey is to determine ways in which teacher-librarians, principals, and technology directors can lead, teach, and support digital citizenship and media literacy across all grades and content areas.

One person at the district level (e.g., Technology Director, CIO, CTO, Teacher-Librarian, or Curriculum Director) should complete the district-level survey questions at <https://www.surveygizmo.com/s3/4266118/DigCit-District>, and one person at each school building (e.g., principal or designee, technology specialist, or teacher-librarian) should complete the building-level questions at <https://www.surveygizmo.com/s3/4287163/DigCit-School>. Every effort has been made to keep the survey as brief and easy to fill out as possible. Educators and
