NEVAC

NEVAC offers you more class choices! Investigate an area of interest through these exciting classes. Explore career choices before you leave high school. Save tuition \$\$ by deciding on a major before you further your education. Take a **NEVAC** class! Participating juniors and seniors provide their own transportation, and spend part of their school day in another high school. Or, try an online **NEVAC** class - open to all grade levels, and can be taken at home. (Some can earn Tech Prep credit, too!) RUNNING START

RUNNING START is a program which offers eligible high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to take technical or community college courses tuition-free while completing high school. Students who are ready for college-level work may use this opportunity to gain an early start on college, or take courses not available through the high school. Both traditional and online classes at community colleges may be taken through **RUNNING START!** Grades and credits earned are recorded on both the college and high school permanent transcripts. COLLEGE in the HIGH SCHOOL



COLLEGE in the HIGH SCHOOL is another opportunity for students to earn college credit while enrolled in a high school class. Students pay a fee to the college, meet other requirements, and earn a college transcript. TECH PREP



Dual-credit is a good deal!! **TECH PREP** is an opportunity for students to earn community/technical college credit while enrolled in their high school's 'tech prep' classes. Students pay an annual \$25 application fee to the college where credit is given, earn a grade of B or better in class, meet all other class requirements, and receive a college transcript. At Shorecrest, these **TECH PREP** courses are offered: Accounting 1, 2, 3, 4; Internet & Basic HTML; Computer Applications Intro, 1, 2; Marketing, Web Design 1, 2; Careers with Children 1, 2; Culinary Arts; Drafting Technology 1, 2, Advanced; Visual Technology.

FIRE SERVICE TRAINING

What a unique opportunity! **FIRE SERVICE TRAINING** is the place to be if you are interested in the various careers found in this industry. Taught by fire-fighting professionals, students are introduced to all aspects of this challenging field: firefighter training; fire prevention; inspection and investigation; alarm systems; dispatching; and emergency medical services. The class is held Monday-Friday during first and second periods at the Shoreline Fire Department Training Center on 175th and Aurora. This class is offered through Shorewood High School, is available to juniors and seniors, and counts as 2.0 Occupational credits. See the Shorecrest Career Specialist for more information.
