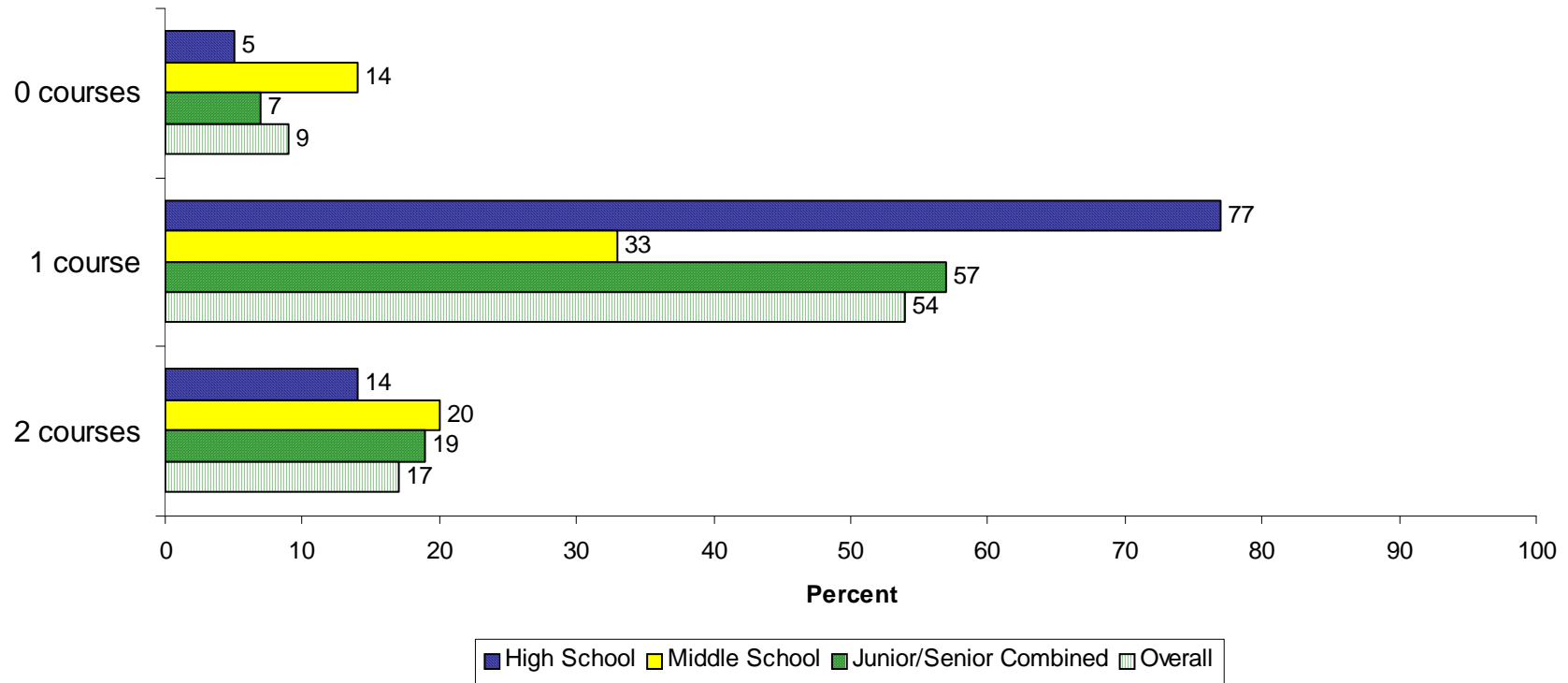
3. Required health education is taught in each of the following ways to students in grades 6 through 12.*

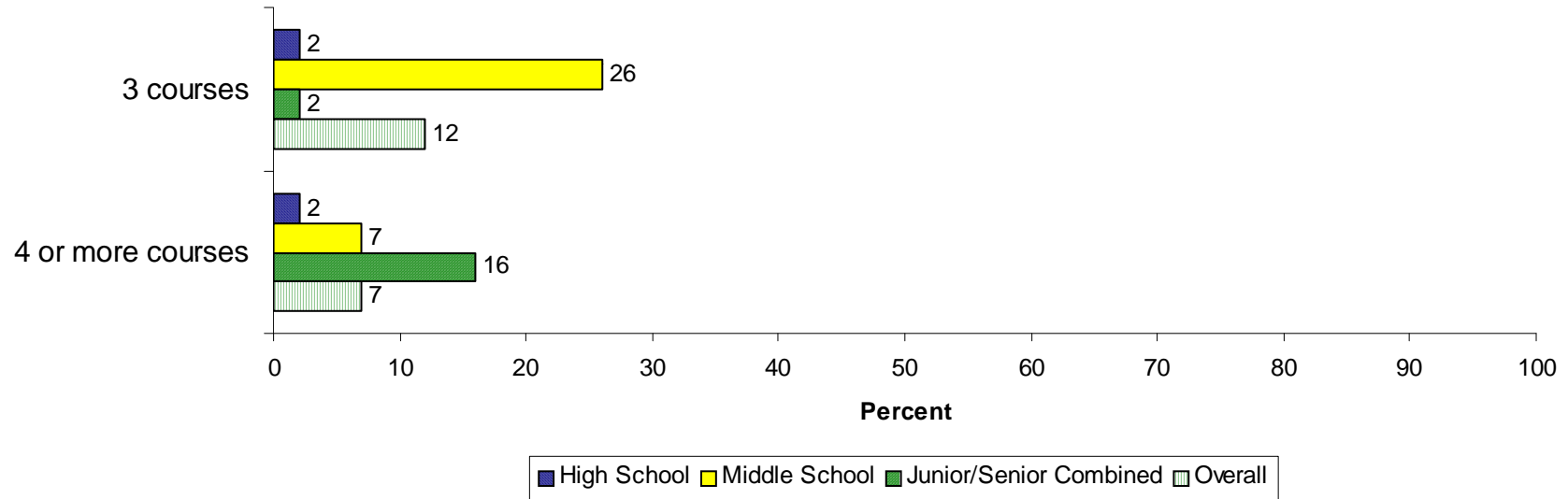
4. Number of required health education courses students take in grades 6 through 12.*

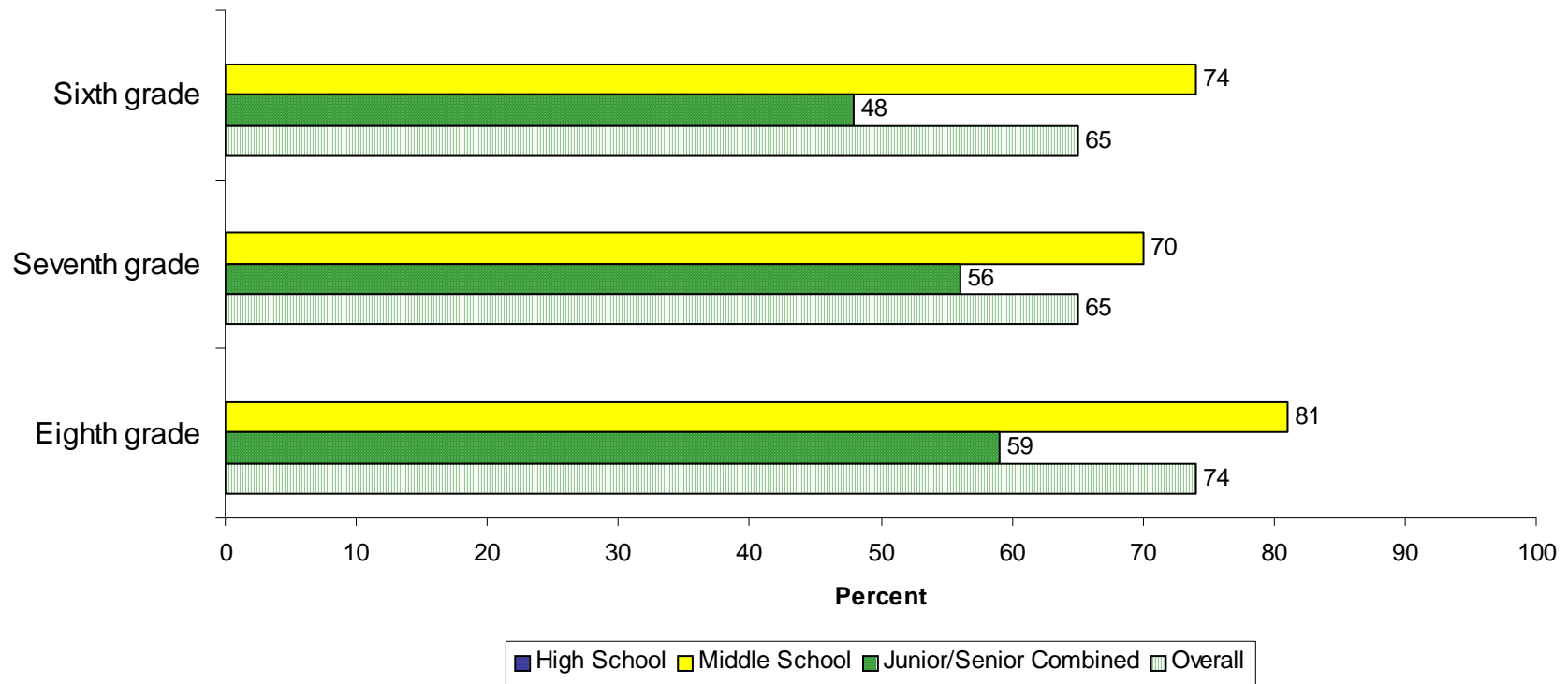
4. Number of required health education courses students take in grades 6 through 12.*

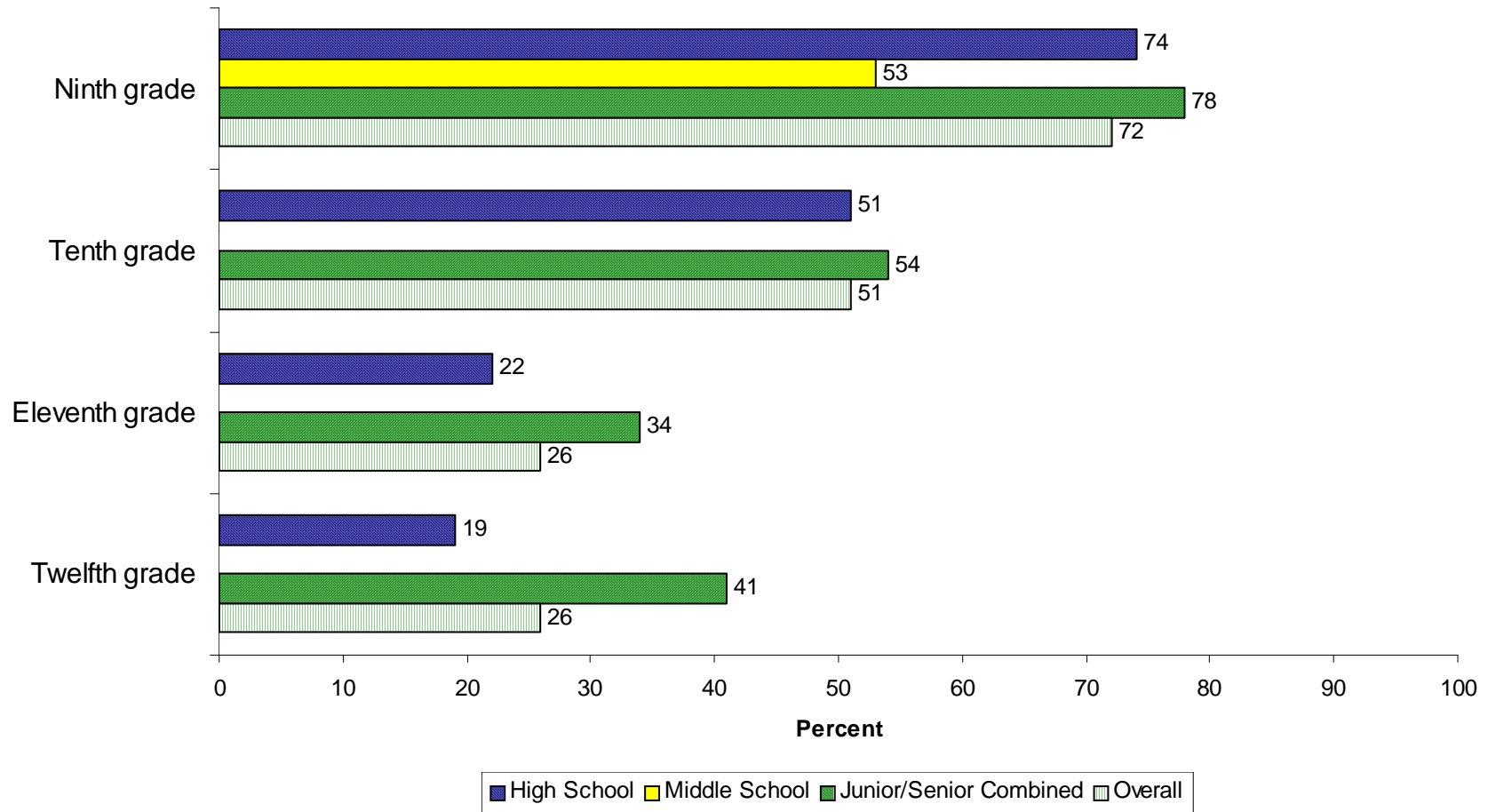
5. A required health education course is taught in each of the following grades.*

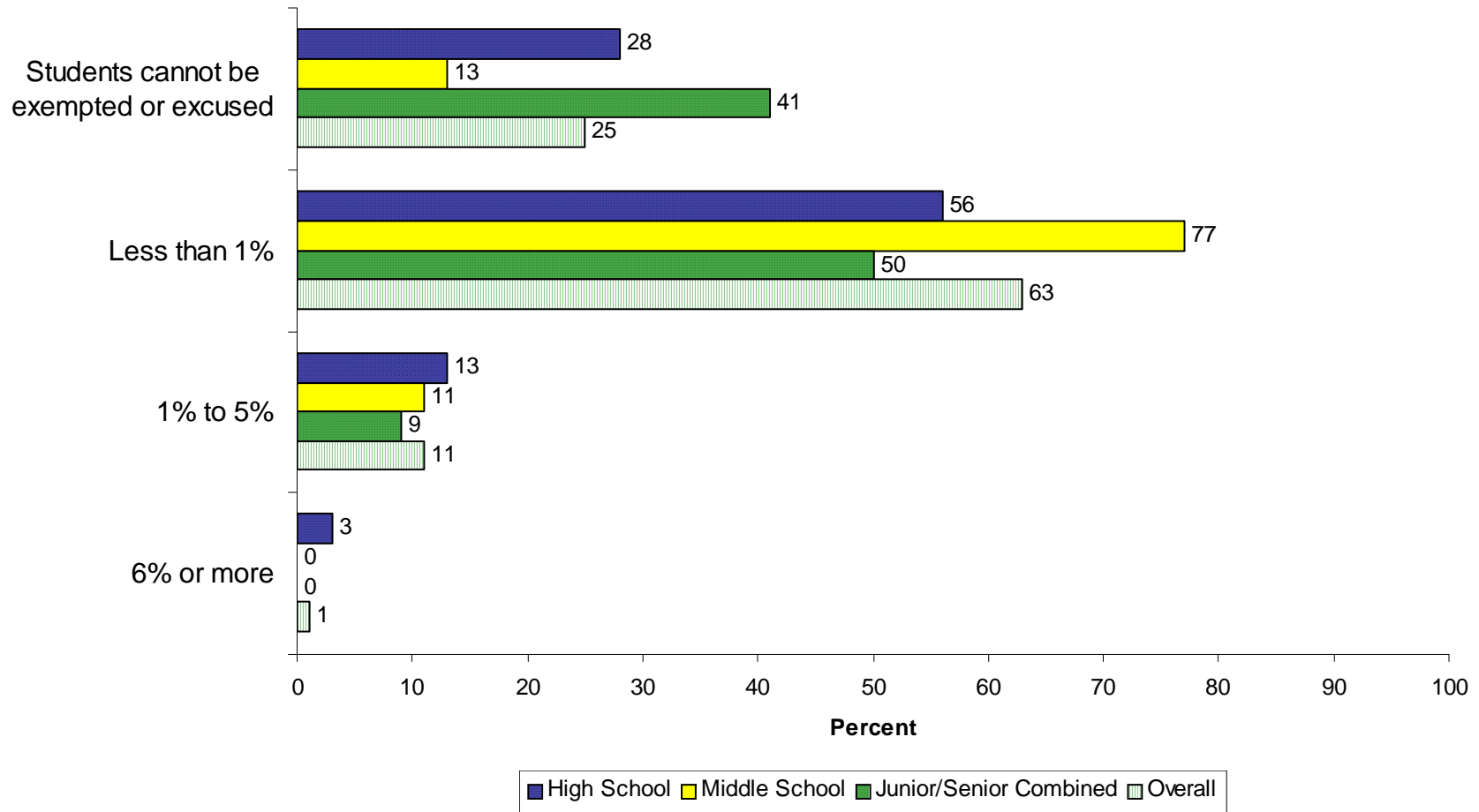

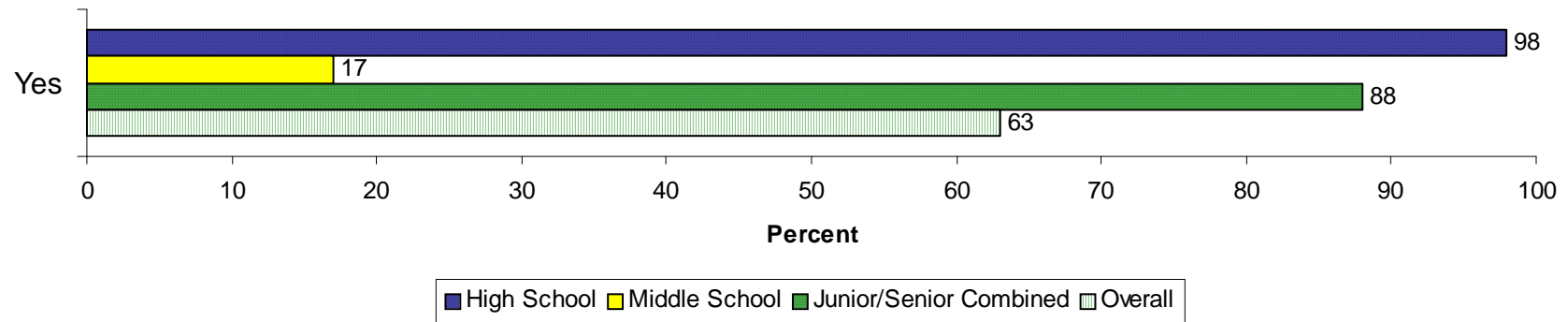
6. Percent of students in grades 6 through 12 who are exempted or excused from any part of a required health education course by parental request.*

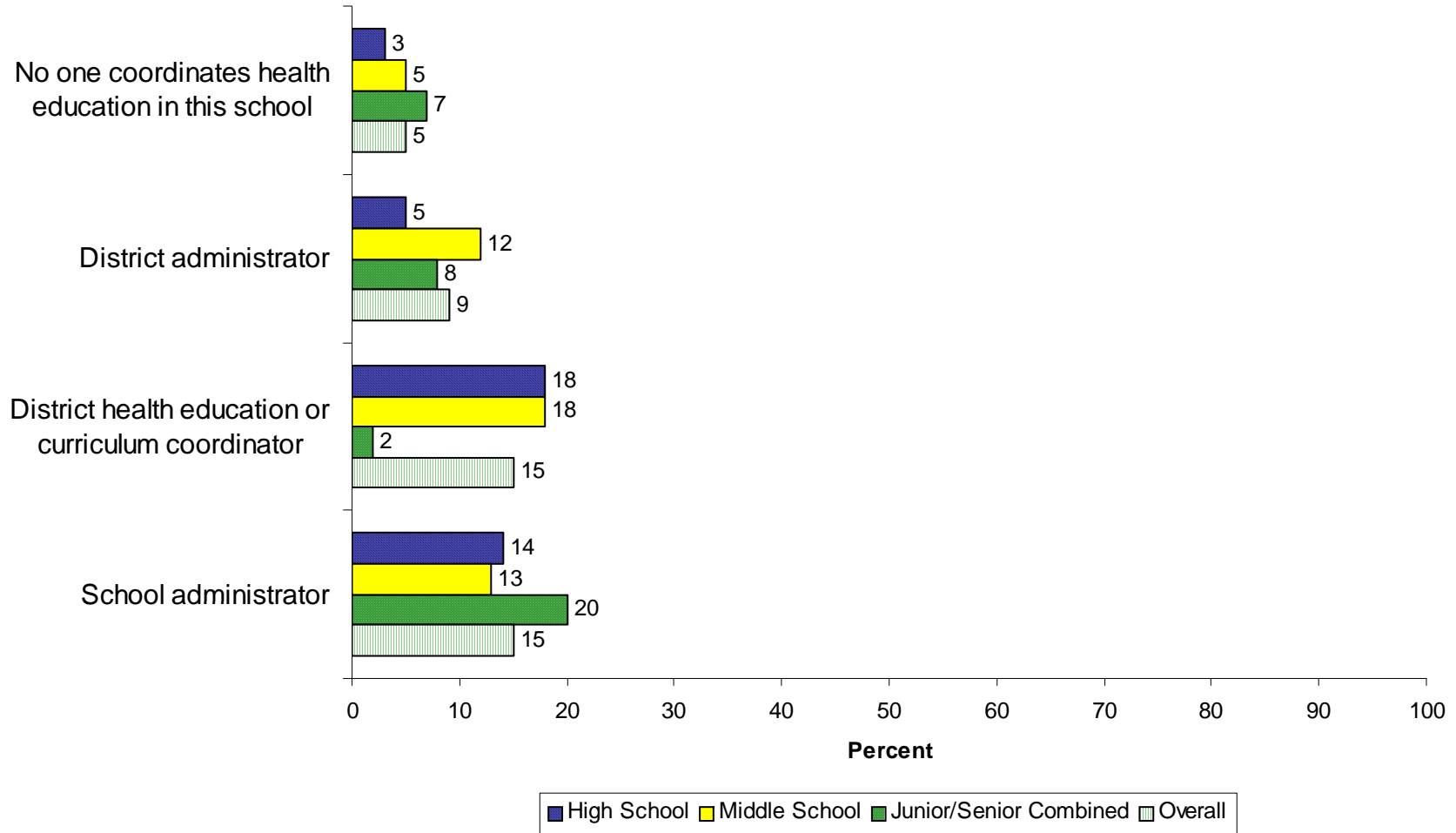

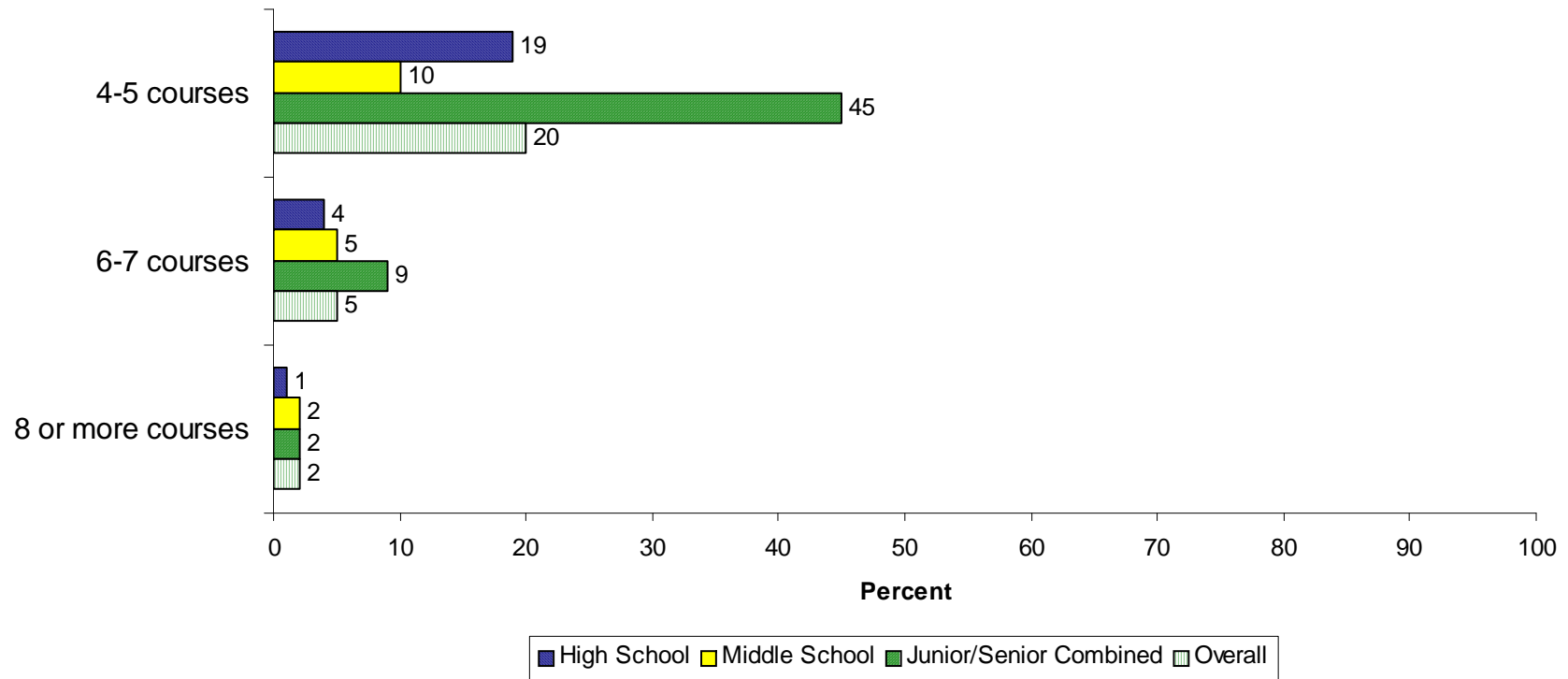
12. Number of required physical education courses students take in grades 6 through 12.*

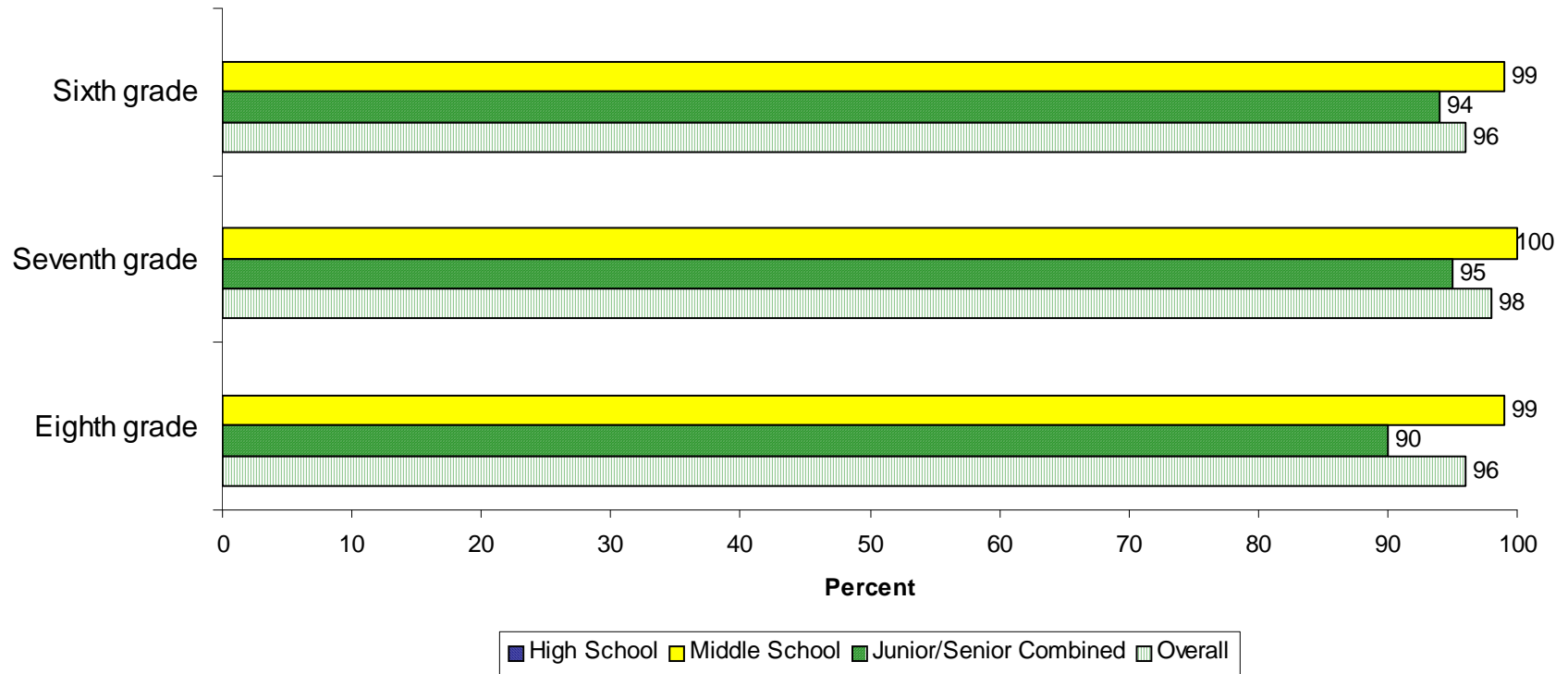

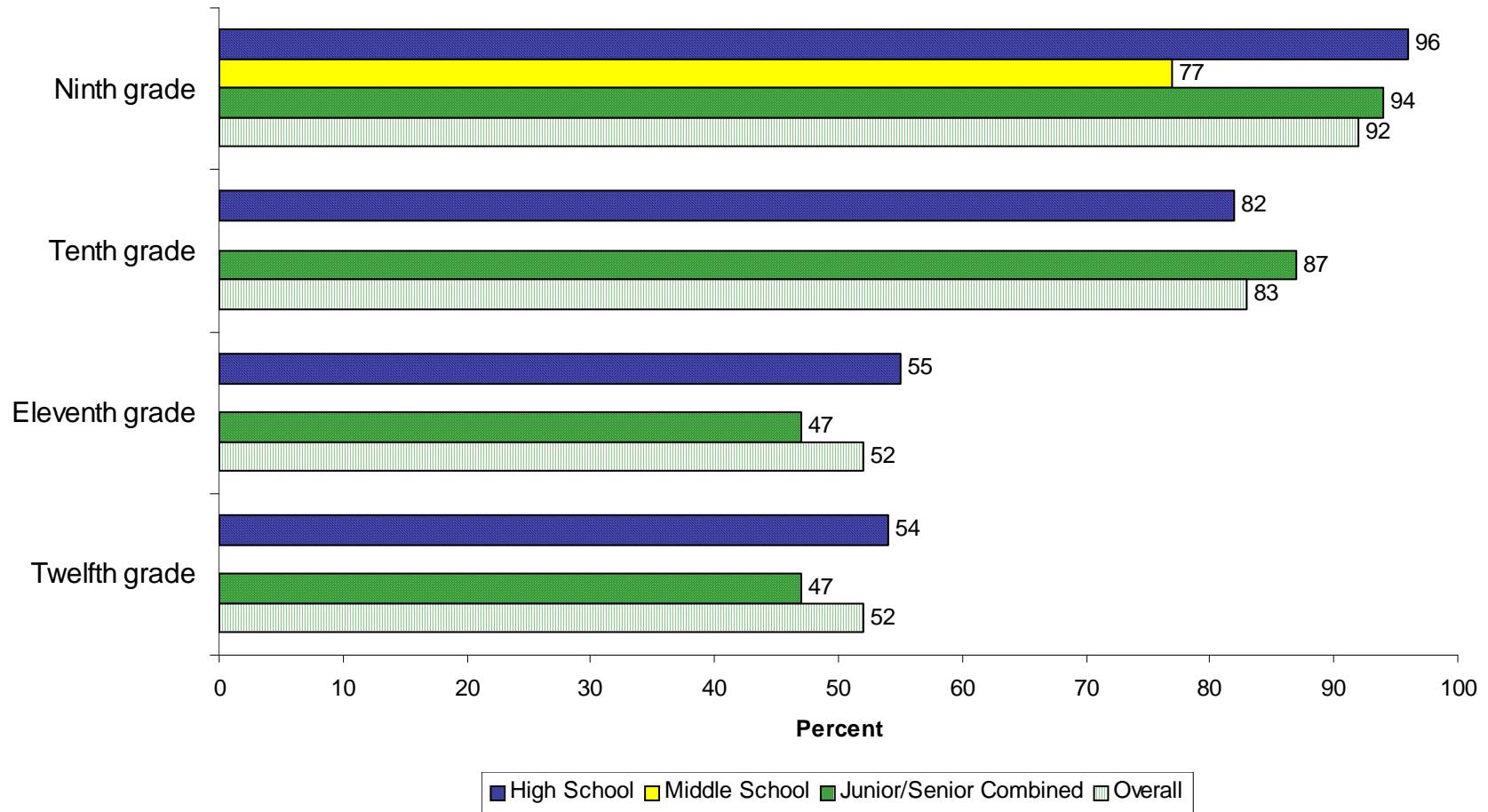
13. A required physical education course is taught in each of the following grades.*

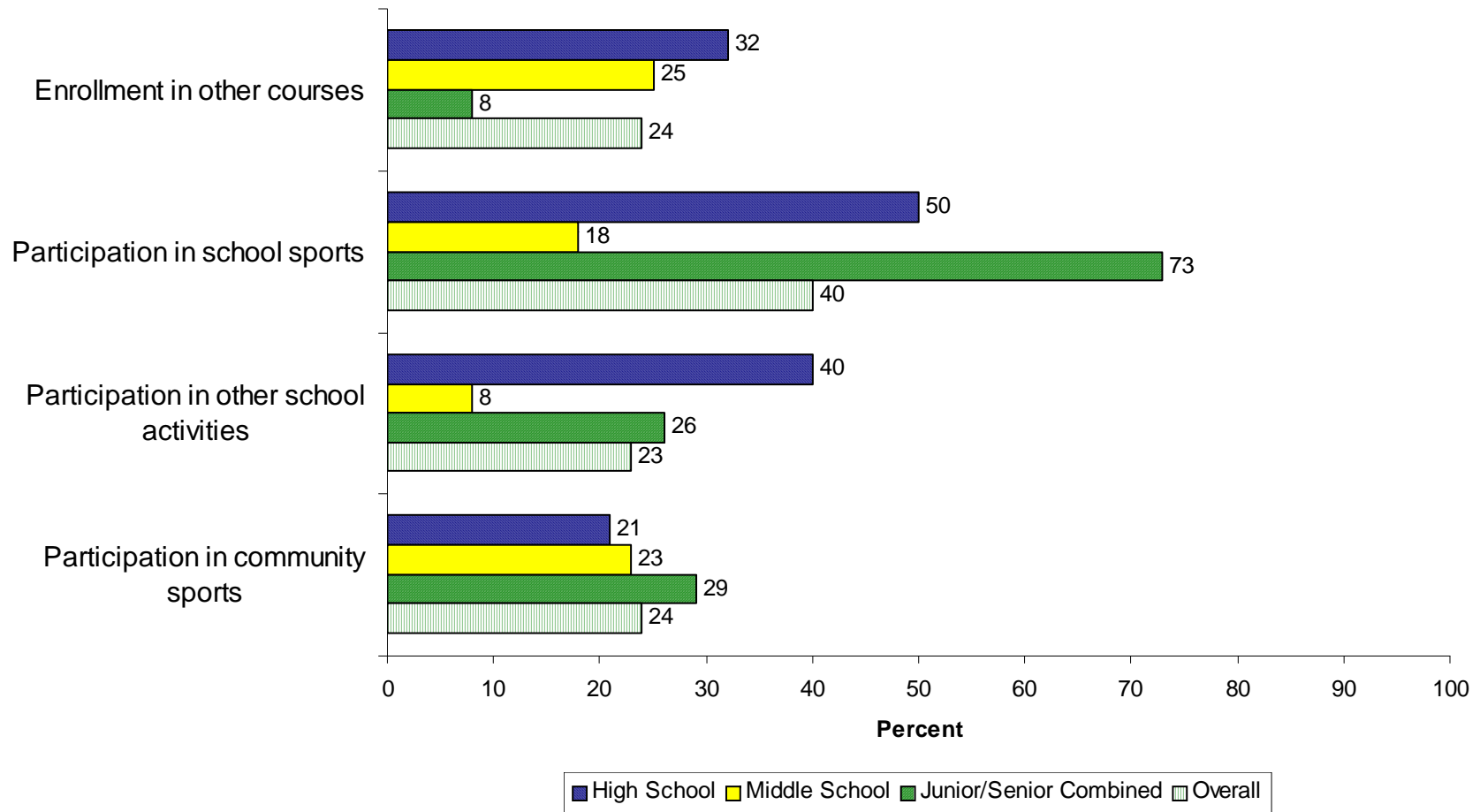

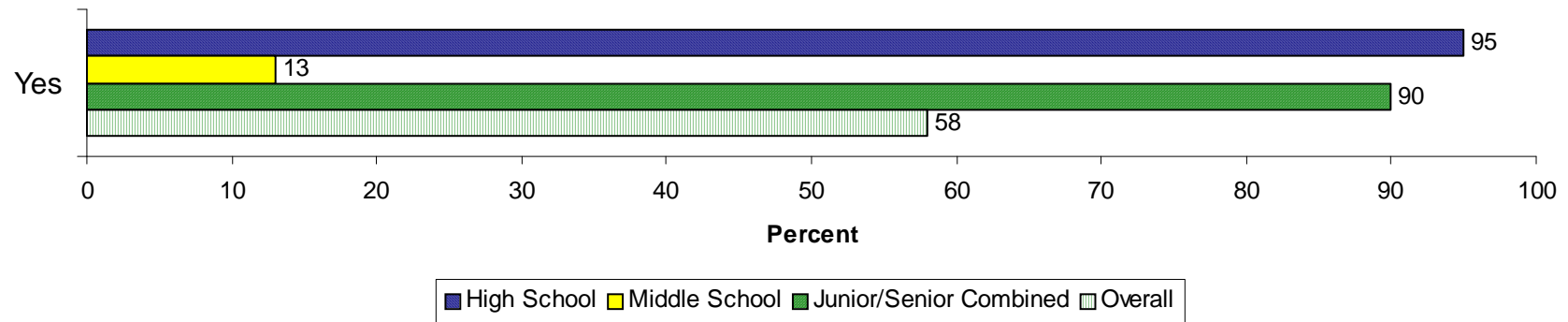
14. Students can be exempted from taking a required physical education course for any of the following reasons.*

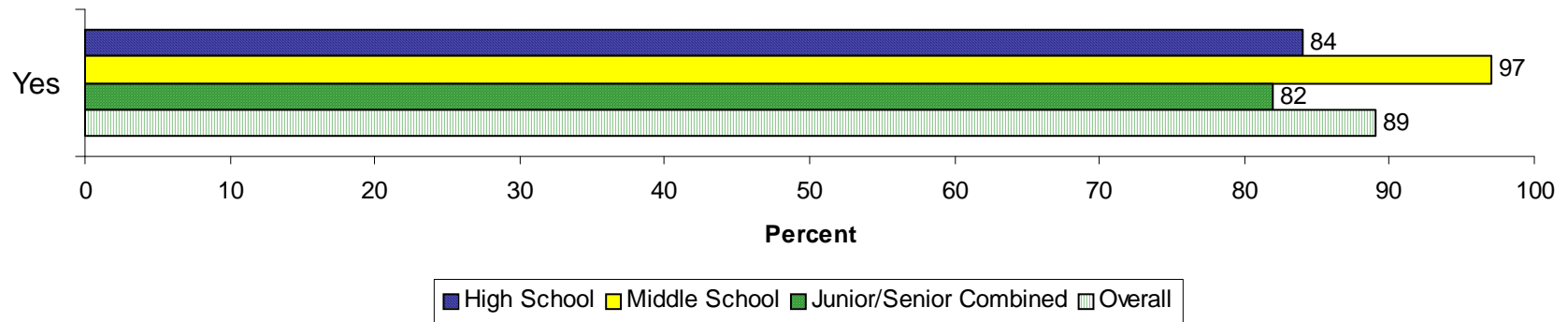

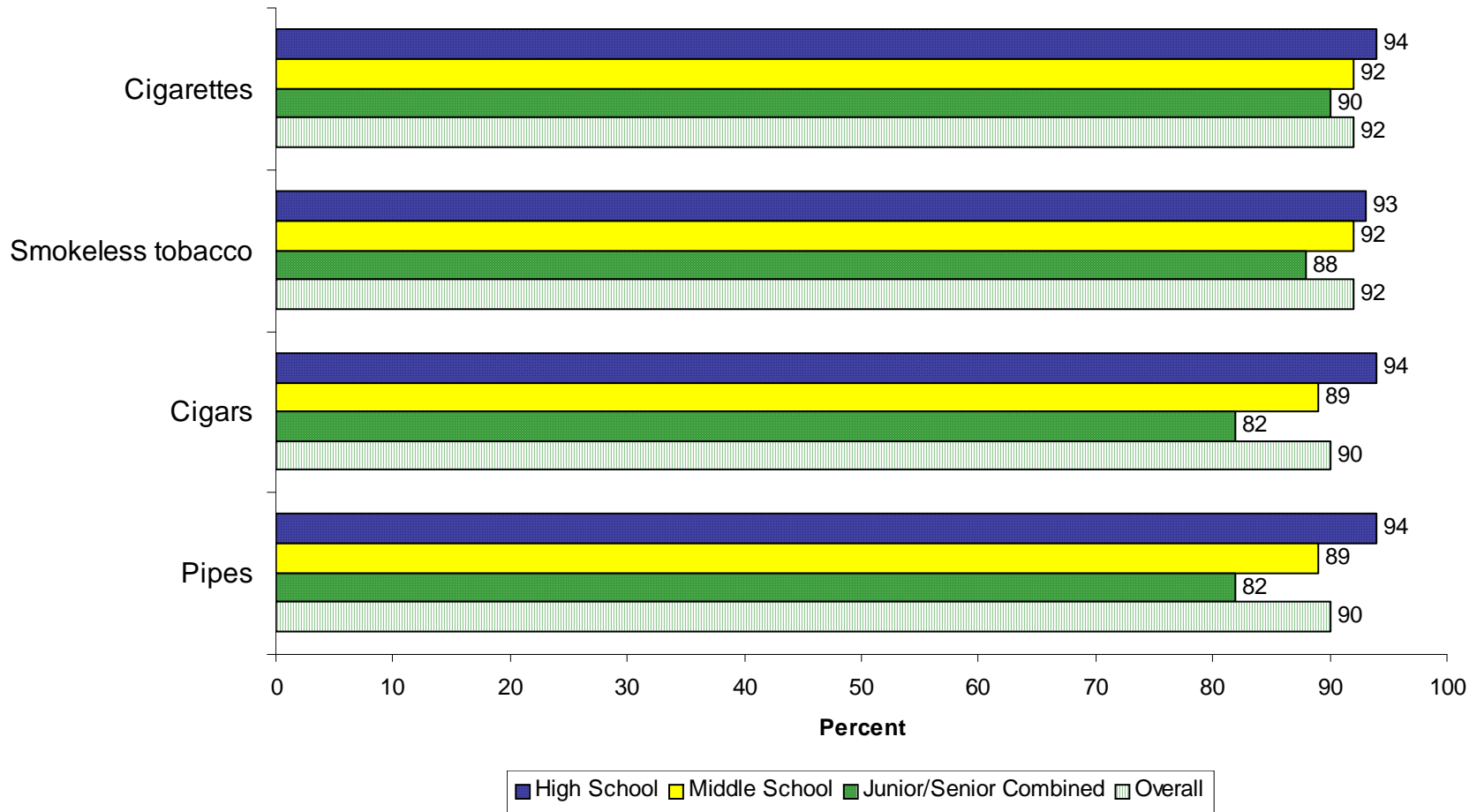

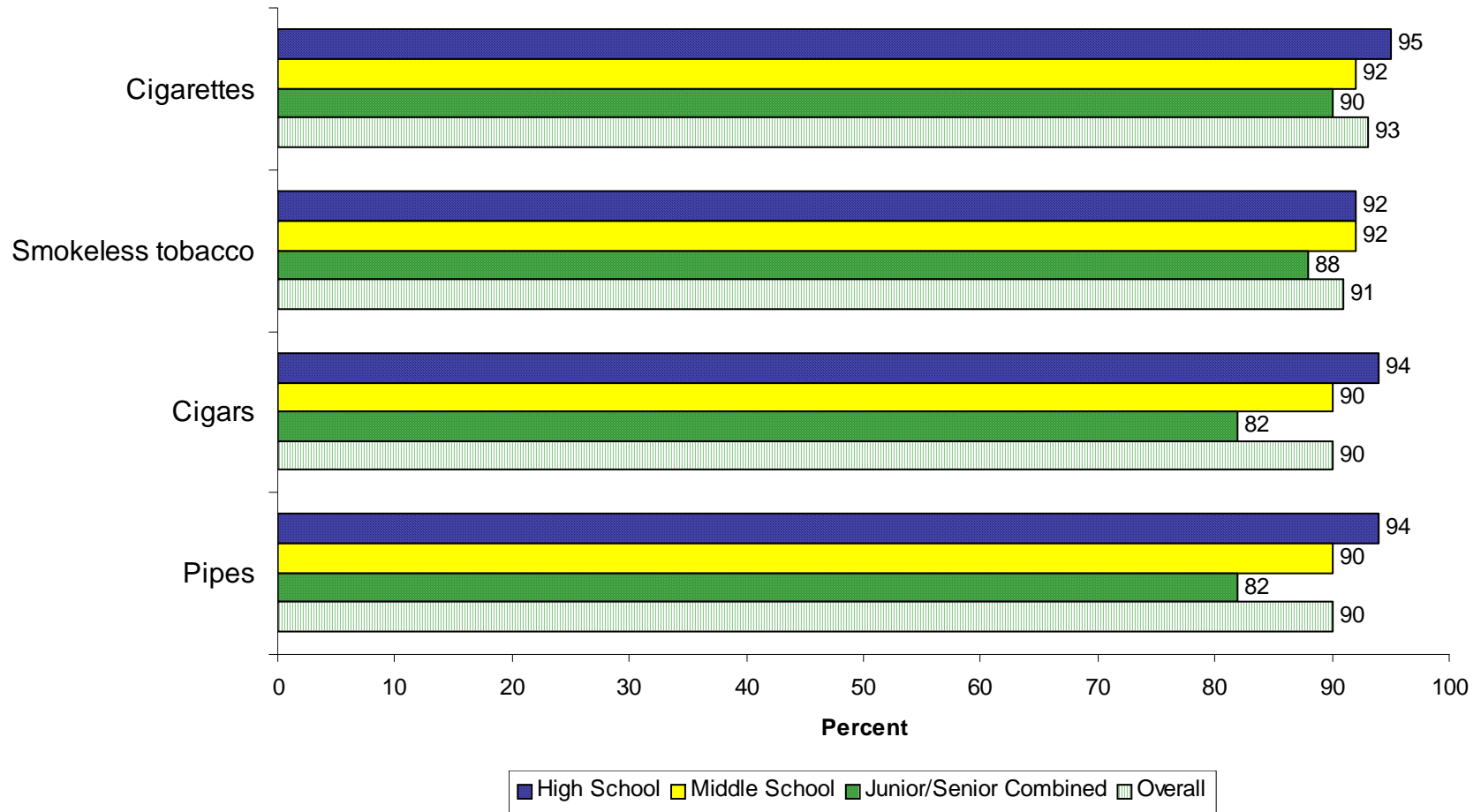
21B. The tobacco prevention policy specifically prohibits the use of each type of tobacco for faculty/staff.*

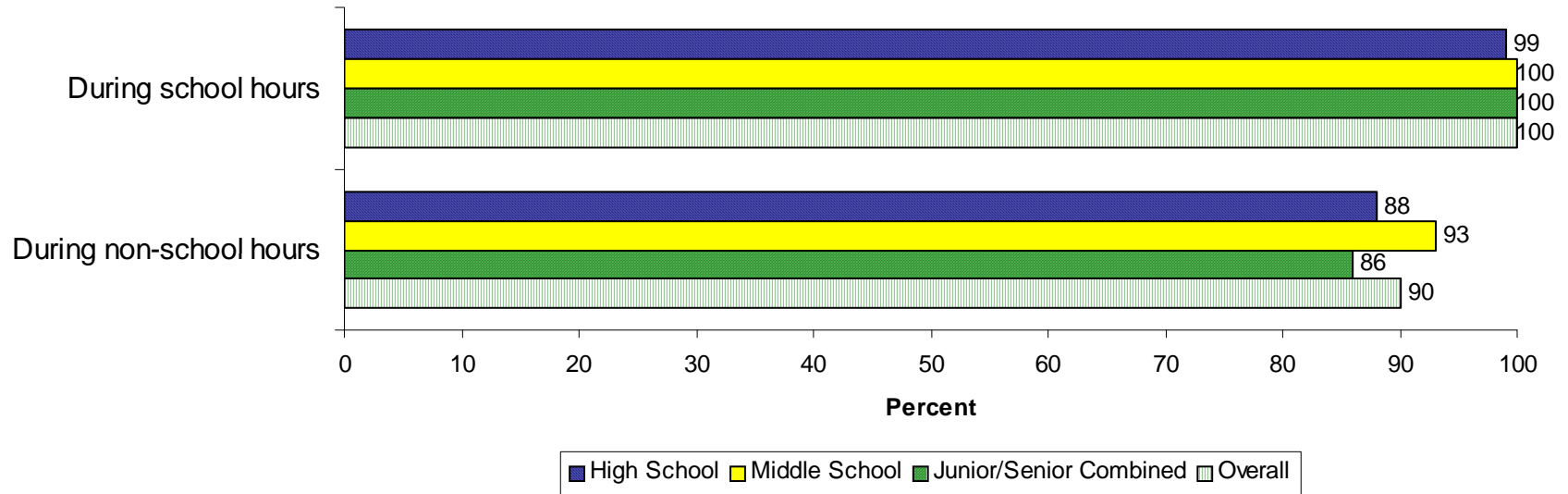
21C. The tobacco prevention policy specifically prohibits the use of each type of tobacco for visitors.*

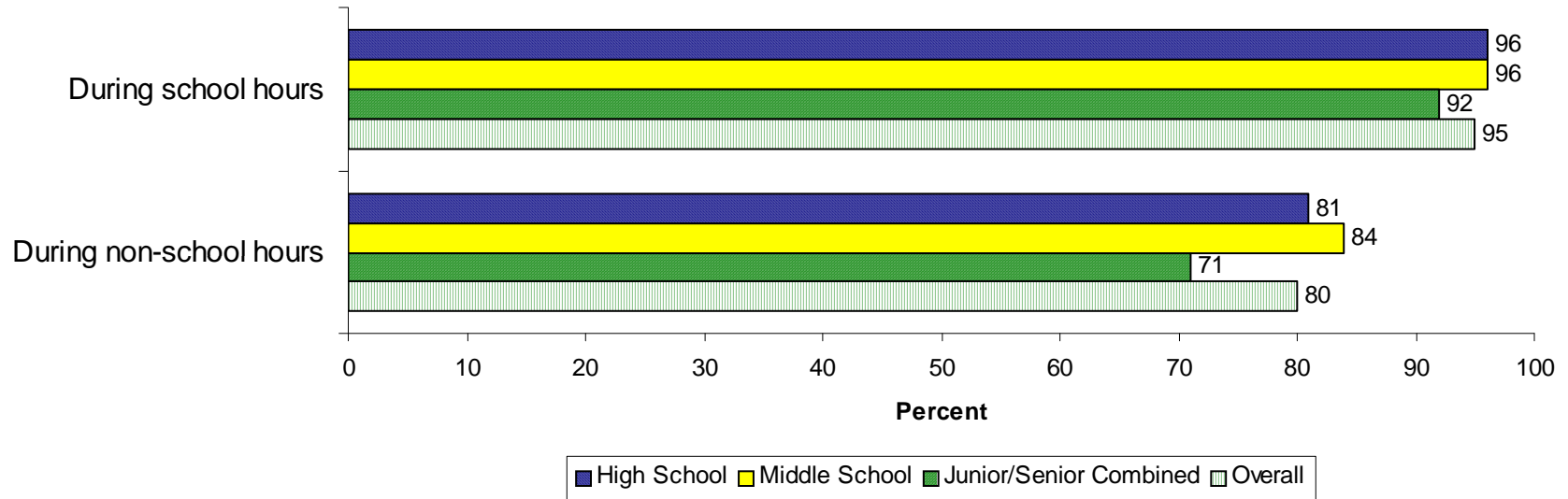
22A. The tobacco prevention policy specifically prohibits tobacco use during each of the following times for students.*

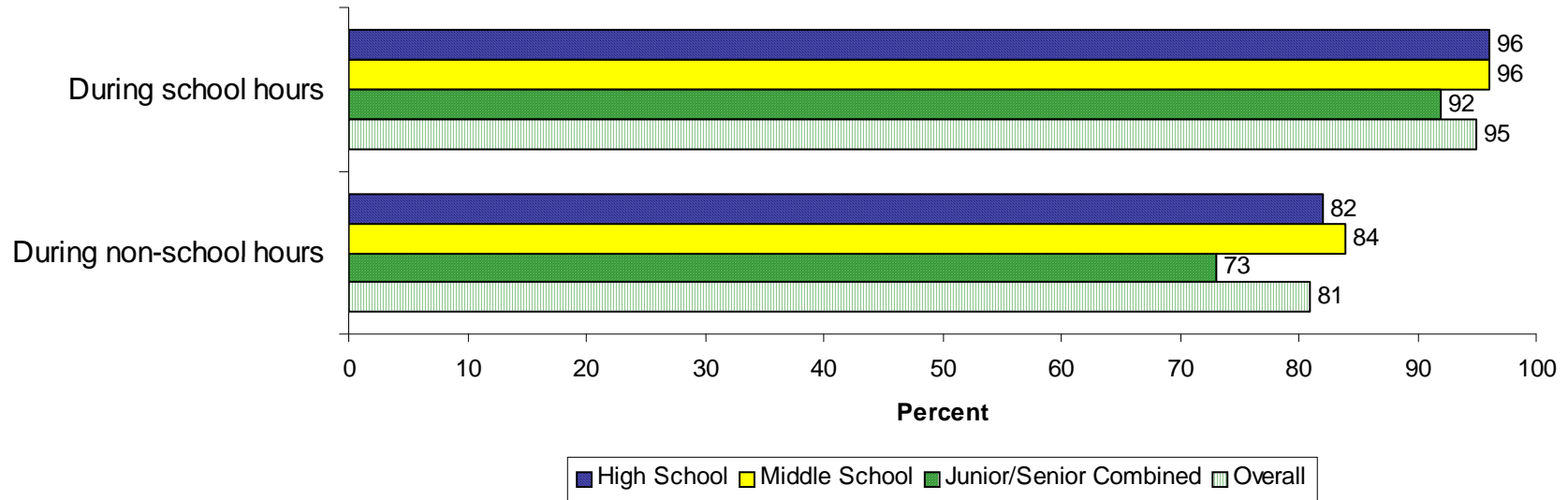

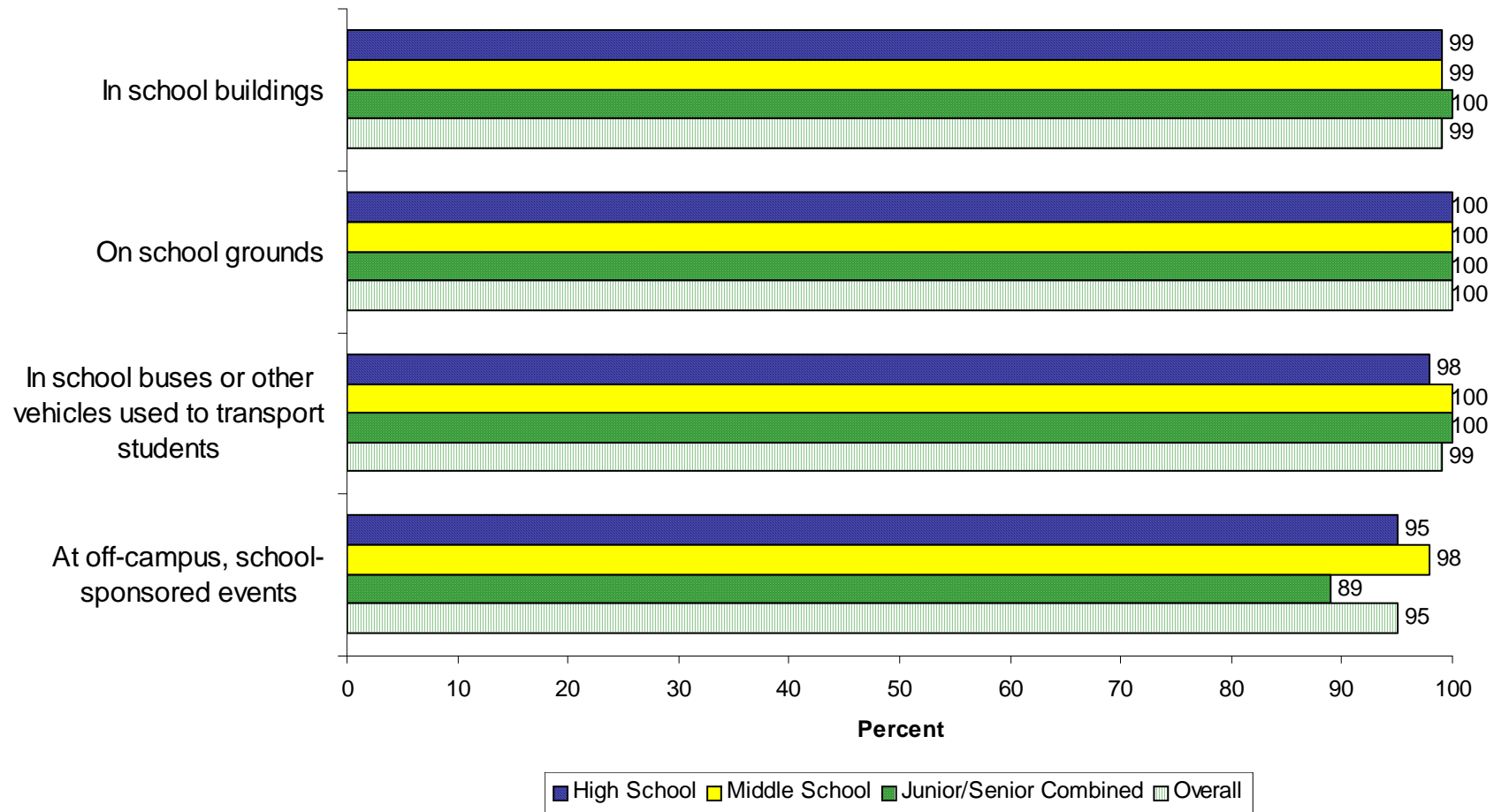

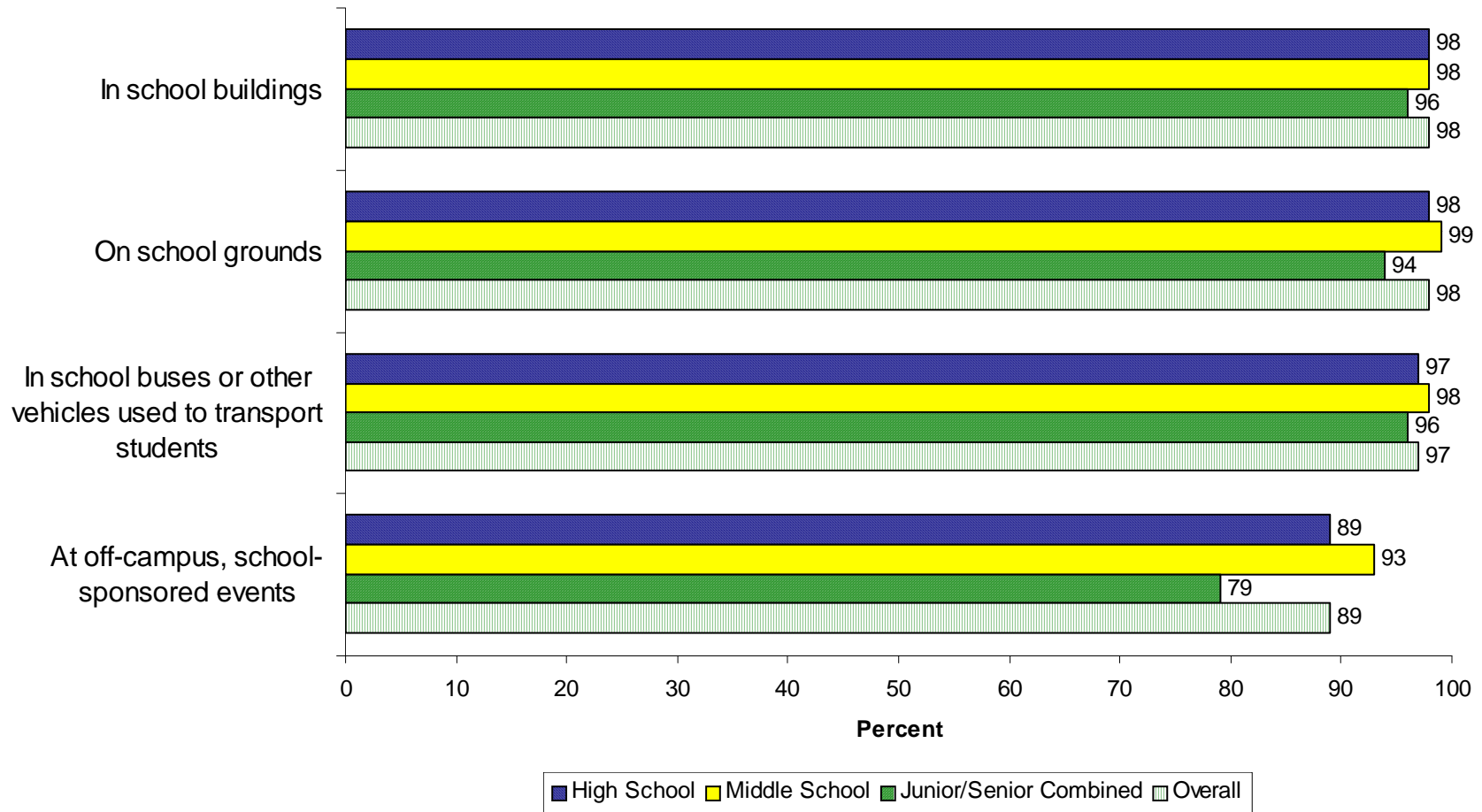
23A. The tobacco prevention policy specifically prohibits tobacco use in each of the following locations for students.*

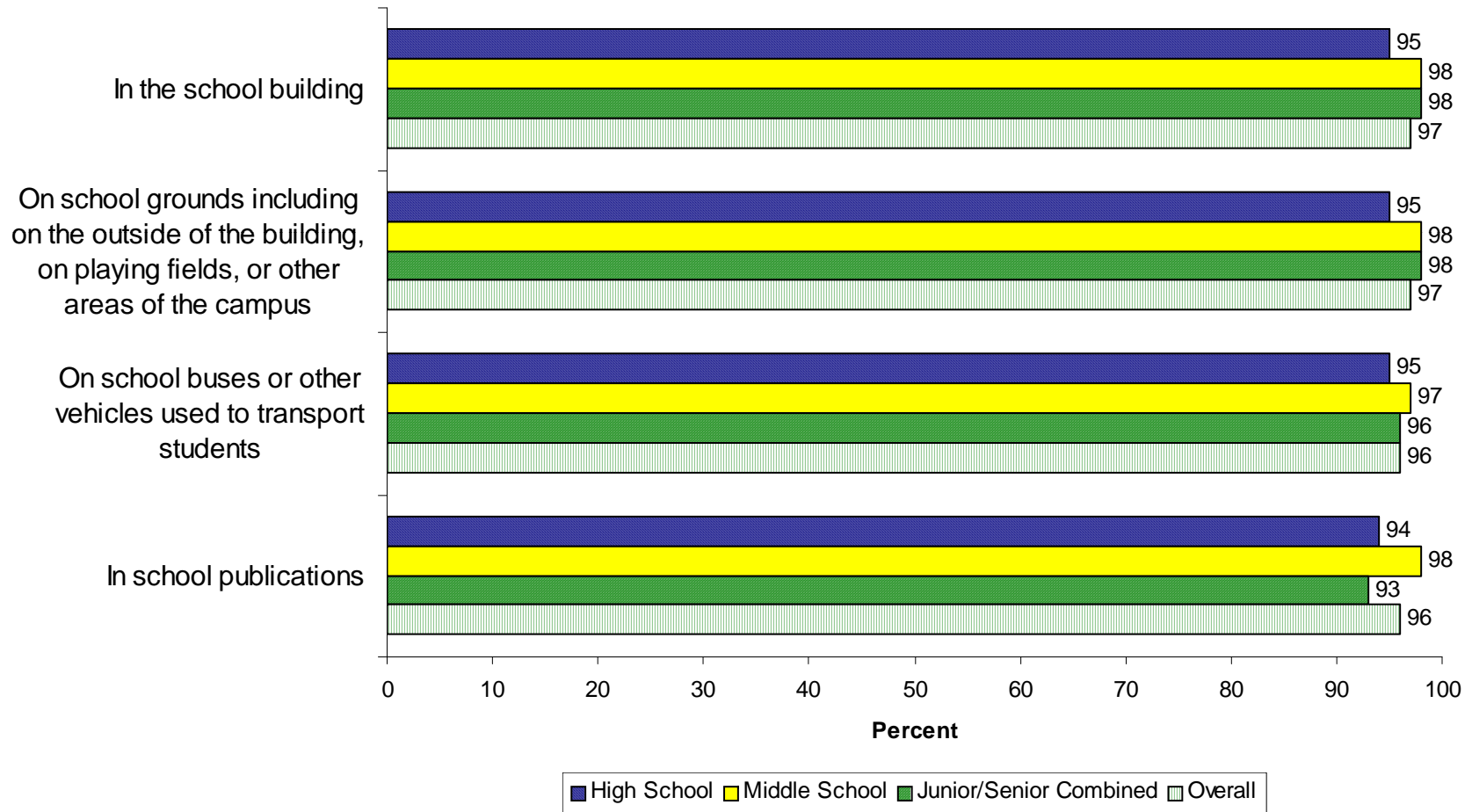

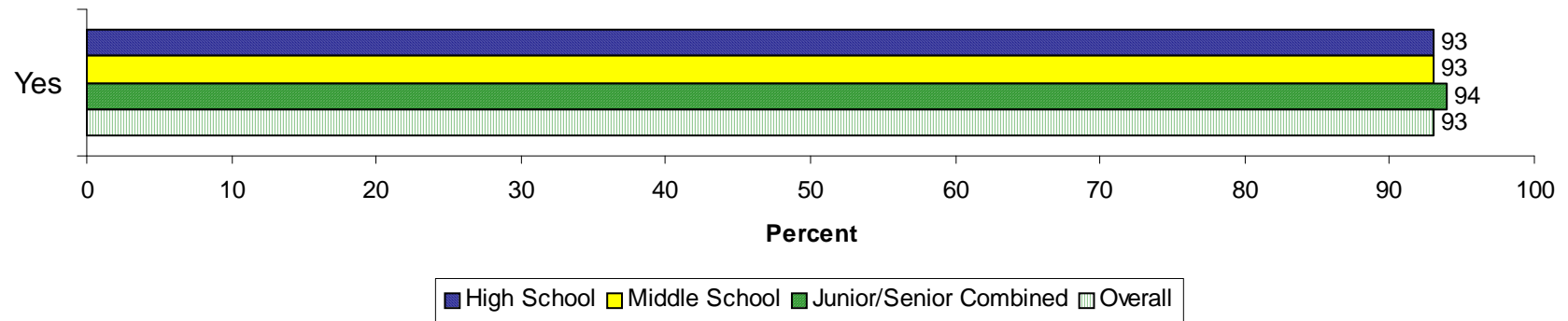

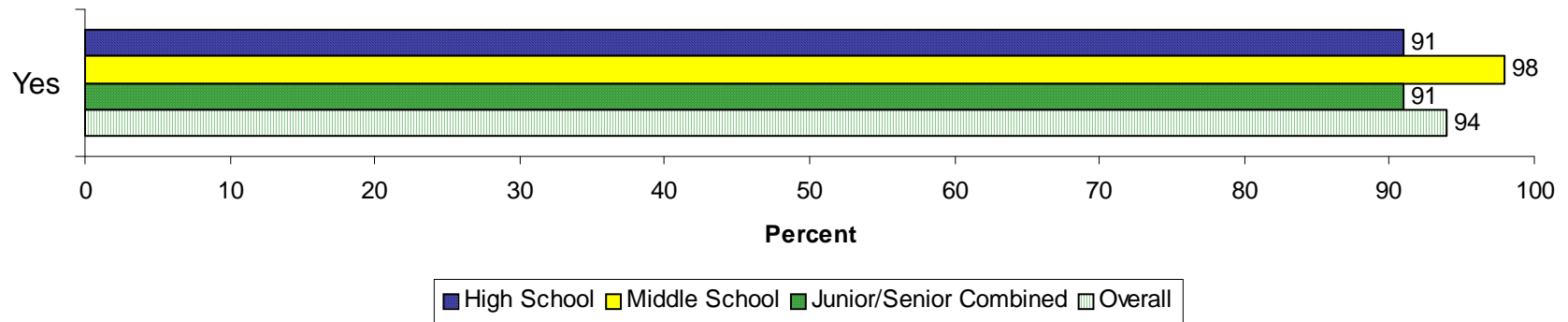

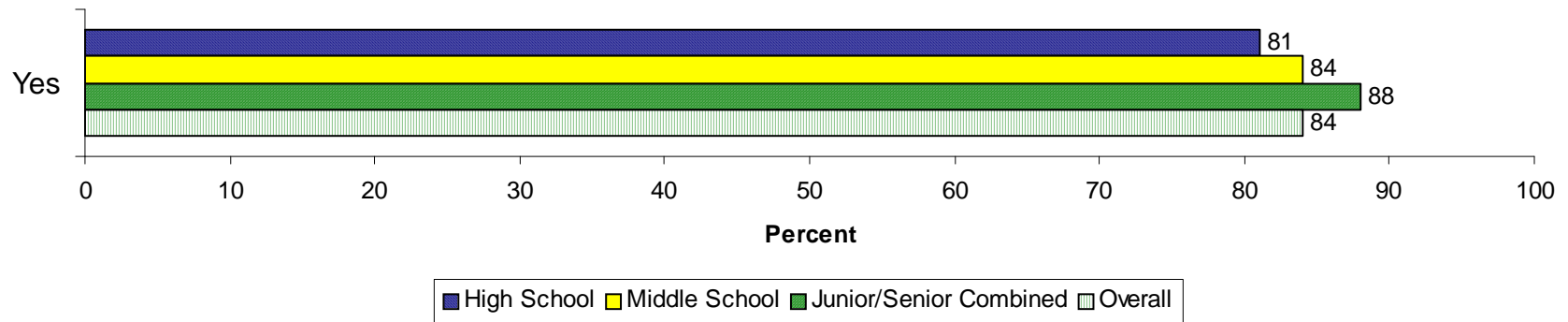

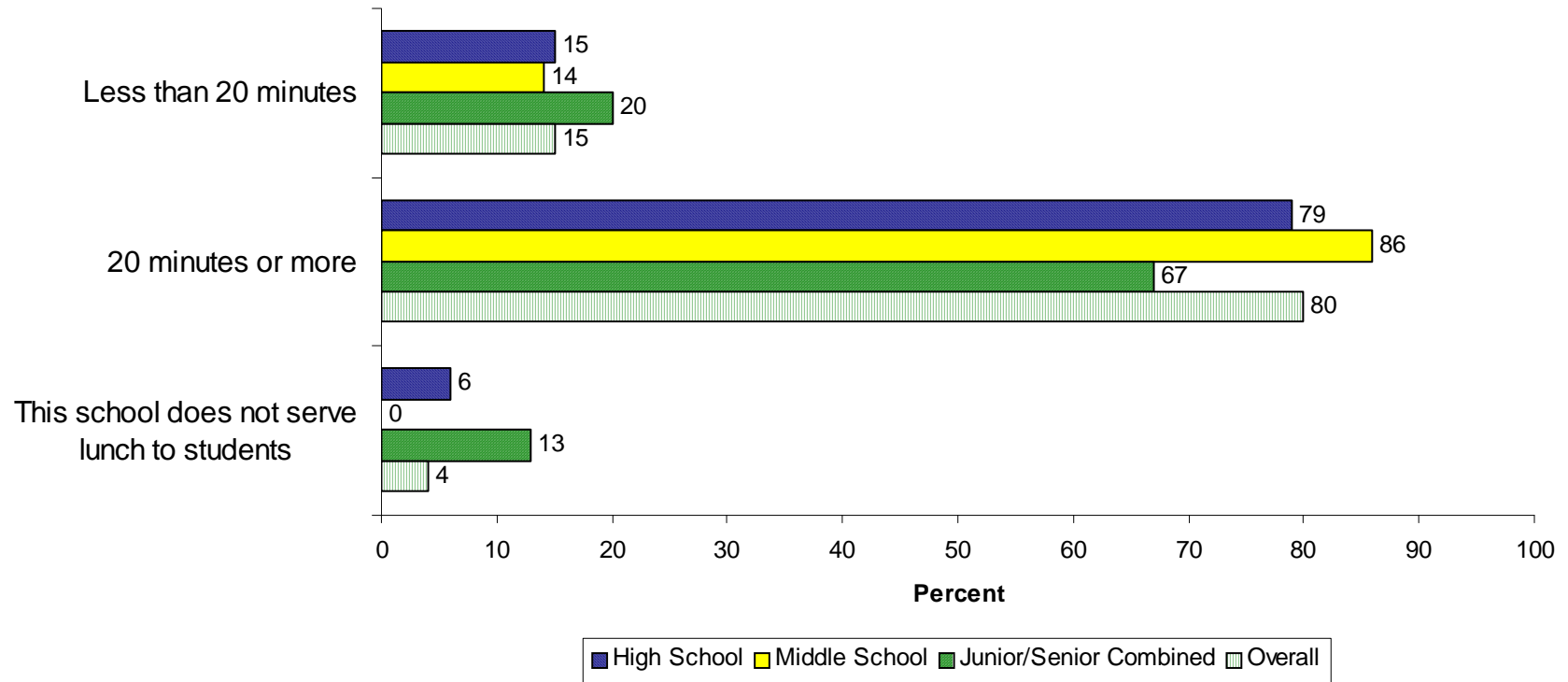
