

Things you can do on this website:

See how well students are performing on annual statewide tests for Math, English, and Science.

See performance results by grade, school, district, and the entire state.

See achievement levels on Math and English tests for the Smarter Balanced and Wa-AIM tests.

Find 4 year (as well as 5, 6, and 7 year) graduation rates by school, district, and state.

See the success rates of students who do not speak English as a first language in mastering English skills.

See school characteristics such as enrollment, attendance, dropout rates, students in accelerated programs, and more.

Look up teacher qualifications.

Look up teacher to student ratios.

Look up school expenditures by fund source.

Look up spending per student for personnel and non-personnel costs.

See growth in student performance.

See performance results for special programs (such as Students with Disabilities and English Language Learners), as well as by race and ethnicity.

See the Washington School Improvement Framework (WSIF) measures for multiple aspects of a school's performance and growth.

Contact a staff person at OSPI who has expertise in school finance, student data, or teacher information.

Translate the website into the language of your choice.

Find links to individual school and district websites, federal information such as Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC) and National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), and the Education and Research Data Center (ERDC) at the state's Office of Financial Management.

Use a “Compare My School” feature that allows side-by-side comparisons of schools with similar attributes.

Print a one-page summary of your school’s performance in your choice of English or several other languages commonly spoken in Washington state.

Group data by Educational Support Districts (ESDs), Legislative Districts, Counties and more.

See updated information for the Washington School Improvement Framework (WSIF) and graduation rates.

Look up terms in a glossary.

Find explanations of special situations and practices in a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) section.
