COMES NOW the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI), under the authority granted by the laws of the state of Washington, having reviewed the file of the above-referenced case, and having considered the entire evidence contained therein, does hereby deny the education application of Hayward R. Hall based on the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law set forth below:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Hayward R. Hall was issued a Washington State Elementary and Secondary Certificate, No. 195853G on April 4, 1979. This certificate currently remains revoked.

On his applications dated June 7, 1976 and February 1, 1979, he answered "no" to the question: "Within the last 10 years, have you ever been convicted, fined, or imprisoned or placed on probation for violation of any law, police regulation or

ordinance (excluding minor traffic violations for which a fine or forfeiture of \$100 or less was imposed?)”.

2. Hayward R. Hall was employed by the Seattle School District for the 1973/1974 school year. On October 14, 1988, the School District issued him a letter of probable cause for immediate termination for a continued pattern of insubordination and/or unprofessional conduct. The discharge was upheld in hearing.

3. Hayward R. Hall was employed by the Clover Park School District in September 1992. He was fingerprinted on October 8, 1992 as required by RCW 28A.400.303.

The results from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) check provided the following information: 3/29/69 arrest in Seattle, Washington for Soliciting a Minor for Immoral Purposes. He was sentenced to 90 days in jail, which was suspended.

4. On March 28, 1996, the Clover Park School District issued him a letter of intent to discharge. The discharge was based upon inappropriate and unprofessional behavior, disruptive behavior within the educational processes, and threatening statements to the school principal. The discharge was upheld in hearing.

5. On April 28, 1997 a Final Order of Revocation was issued by the Superintendent of Public Instruction of the state of Washington for various violations of WAC 180-87, 180-75 (recodified as WAC 180-86), and RCW 28A.410.090.

6. On February 16, 2000, Hayward R. Hall submitted an application for a Washington State Teaching Certificate.

In Section III, Criminal History, he answered "no" to the following questions: 1) Have you ever been arrested for any crime or violation of the law? 2) Have you ever been fingerprinted as a result of any arrest for any crime or violation of the law?, and 3) Have you ever been convicted of any crime or violation of any law?

Hayward R. Hall signed the Affidavit certifying under the penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington that the foregoing and all information included in the application is true and correct.

7. Good moral character and personal fitness is a requirement to attain a Washington education certificate.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. OSPI has jurisdiction over Hayward R. Hall and over the subject matter of this action.

2. Hayward R. Hall has failed to provide clear and convincing evidence of good moral character or personal fitness to receive a Washington education certificate, Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 180-86-170.

3. Hayward R. Hall violated WAC 180-87-050 and RCW 28A.410.090.


ORDER
