The Office of Professional Practices has completed its investigation of the above-referenced application for certification and hereby enters a Denial of Application for Certification Order based on the following:

Findings of Fact

1. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. submitted an Application for a Washington Initial Teaching Certificate through Eastern Washington University on June 3, 1997.
2. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr., as a part of the application process, completed a Character and Fitness Supplement, also dated June 3, 1997.
3. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. answered "no" to Question 1, Section III, which reads: "Have you ever been arrested for any crime or violation of the law?"

4. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. answered "yes" to Question 2, Section III, which reads: "Have you ever been fingerprinted as a result of any arrest for any crime or violation of the law?"

5. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. answered "yes" to Question 3, Section III, which reads: "Have you ever been convicted of any crime or violation of any law?"

6. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. provided a statement in which he declares, under perjury, that: "I, Glenn La-Marr Hartman Jr., did unlawfully have possession of drug paraphernalia on the 27th day of September, 1994."

In a separate statement, Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. stated "I took a carboard box and lined it with aluminum foil, put the (marijuana) seeds in a little potter, and attached a 60 watt desk lamp to the box." Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. concluded: "I was never arrested but I was in trouble."

7. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. pleaded guilty to the charge of Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. He was fined \$800 with all but \$250 deferred, sentenced to 90 days in jail with 89 days deferred, and placed on probation for one year.

On November 20, 1995, with the probation conditions met, the case was dismissed. On November 30, 1995, and order to vacate judgement was entered.

8. On February 24, 1998, Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. exhibited unprofessional behavior when discussing his case with various members of the Office of Professional Practices (OPP) staff.

When asked by the OPP Receptionist to spell his name, Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. responded with profanity, "The spelling doesn't fucking matter."

While an OPP investigator was speaking with Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. about the appeal rights relating to the denial of his certification application, Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. replied with anger and profanity. He said to her, "What fucking good is that." He then began yelling at the investigator, who had to move the telephone was from her ear in a protective gesture. He then hung up on the investigator.

Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. then called back again to the Office of Professional Practices, asking to speak with the administrator. During that conversation, Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. became extremely upset and abusive. When Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. understood that he would actually be denied a certificate, he responded with profanity and intense anger. He told the OPP administrator, "Denied, you can suck my dick."

9. Glenn LaMarr Hartman, Jr. did also use excessive profanity towards staff of Eastern Washington University, necessitating a call to campus security.

10. Good moral character and personal fitness is a requirement for attaining a Washington education certificate.

Conclusions of Law

The applicant, GLENN LAMARR HARTMAN, JR. has failed to provide clear and convincing evidence that he possesses the good moral character or personal fitness required for certification in the state of Washington.

Order

Therefore, the application for certification of GLENN LAMARR HARTMAN, JR. is hereby denied.
