Purpose: Requirement per RCW 39.04.320 (c) (i) regarding Apprenticeship Utilization necessitate making changes to WAC 392-344-095 and 392-344-165 in order to educate and verify that the districts have fulfilled the apprenticeship utilization requirements. The changes require the district to include language in the construction documents that the apprenticeship requirements must be followed. The other requirement will be a certification by the school district that the apprenticeship reporting requirements are met prior to receiving retainage from the state.
