What is the timeline for these changes?

- Everything discussed today will apply to *next year's* data collection due July 15, 2011 (reporting period July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011)
- This information is being provided now to give districts time to make changes to the current data system
- **There are no changes to the data collection and reporting procedure for the remainder of the 2009-2010 school year**

Why is there a change?

- The federal Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) revised the Indicator Measurement Table of the State Performance Plan (SPP)/Annual Performance Report (APR)
 - The measurement table is how State data is calculated and reported to OSEP each year on the APR
- OSEP added the requirement for States to report the **number of children who were referred to Part C less than 90 days before their third birthdays** on the FFY 2009 APR, due on February 1, 2011

Date of referral to Part C

- This is the date when the child's parents first contacted the Infant Toddler Early Intervention Program (ITEIP) to arrange the initial evaluation for Part C services
- The initial referral date to Part C is available from the Family Resource Coordinator (FRC) or it can be found in the student's Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP)
- Districts have access to the ITEIP electronic data management system

Date of referral to Part C

When a child is *referred to Part C less than 90 days before their third birthday*, this is a new allowable exception for Indicator 12

- Don't confuse this with referred **to Part B** less than 90 days before their third birthday

When this happens:

- The IEP for a child referred **to Part C** *less than 90 days before their third birthday* is not required to be in place by the third birthday
- Districts complete the IEP as close to the third birthday as possible
- The IEP is reported as late on the Indicator 12 data report
- The late IEP is then subtracted out in the data calculation

Date of referral to Part C

- Districts can add the “date of referral to Part C” into the current data system
 - Plan when, where and how this information will be collected
 - Plan where this information will be added in the data system
 - Districts who use an online data system (WSIPC or IEP Online) will work with their vendor to add this information
- Date of referral to Part C will be used in annual reporting for Indicator 12
 - Due on or before July 15 each year

Extended evaluation timeline

- The current data report includes the following exception:
 - “Parent and district agreed to extend the evaluation timeline per the requirements of WAC 392-172A-03005(c)”
 - This is exception D.2
- After July 1, 2010 this will no longer be an allowable exception for Indicator 12, but will remain an allowable exception for Indicator 11
 - **Continue to collect data on this exception**
 - OSPI will continue to report this information to OSEP in the APR, but it can no longer be subtracted out in the data calculation

Transition planning meeting did not occur 90 days before the child's third birthday

- The current data report includes the following exception:
 - “Transition planning meeting convened by Part C did not occur at least 90 days prior to the child's third birthday”
 - This exception is D.5 on the current Indicator 12 template
- After July 1, 2010 this will no longer be an allowable exception for Indicator 12
 - **Continue to collect data on this exception**
 - OSPI will continue to report this information to OSEP in the APR, but it can no longer be subtracted out in the data calculation

How this information can help

- Differentiating late referrals to Part C and Part B will help districts drill down into the Indicator 12 data in order to:
 - Identify where challenges exist in the transition process
 - Establish/improve a cohesive tracking system to prevent children from falling through the cracks
 - Create an improvement plan to help prevent non-compliance
 - Establish/improve district protocol for managing late referrals to Part C and Part B when they occur
 - Enhance collaboration between Part C and Part B programs
 - Improve district's level of determination

Preview of Revised Data Collection Templates for Indicators 12 and 11

- Will be posted after July 15, 2010 to be used in the 2010-2011 school year

Any child reported in this indicator must also be included in Indicator 11, Timeline for Initial Evaluation.

Number of children served in Part C, and referred to Part B for eligibility determination.

Number of children referred from Part C, and who did not complete the eligibility determination process.

Reminders About Reporting Indicator 12 Data

- “Other” category—each reason reviewed individually
 - Make sure you provide a good description, OSPI staff review each exception reported in the “Other” categories
- “IEP in place” does not mean that services have begun
 - The IEP has been developed and is signed by the third birthday, with a projected start date indicating when services will begin.
 - For a child with a summer birthday, services can begin after the third birthday WAC 392-172A-02000 (1). Right to FAPE begins at age three.
- **Anyone reported in Indicator 12 is also reported in Indicator 11 since it will be an initial IEP for that child**

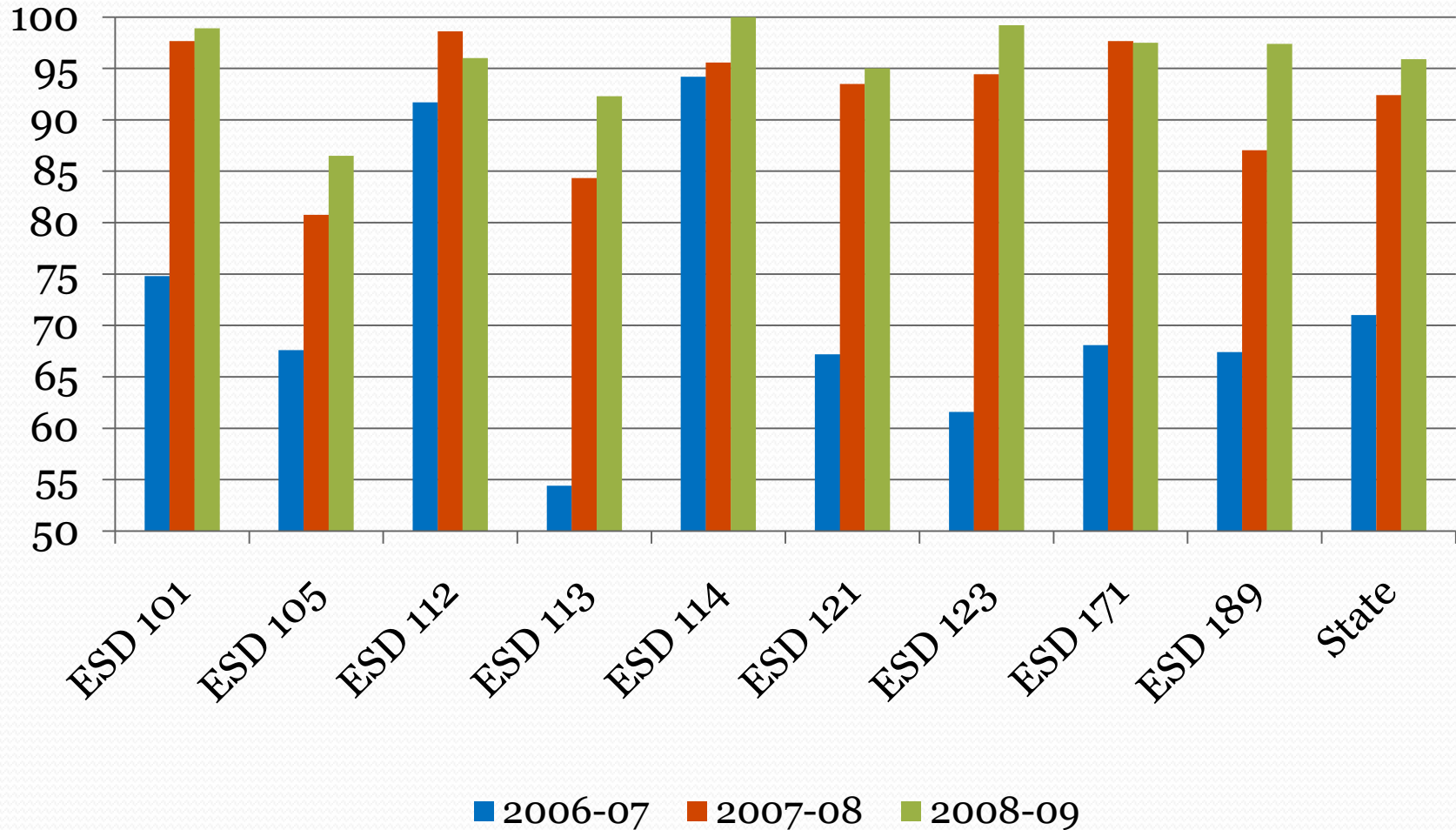

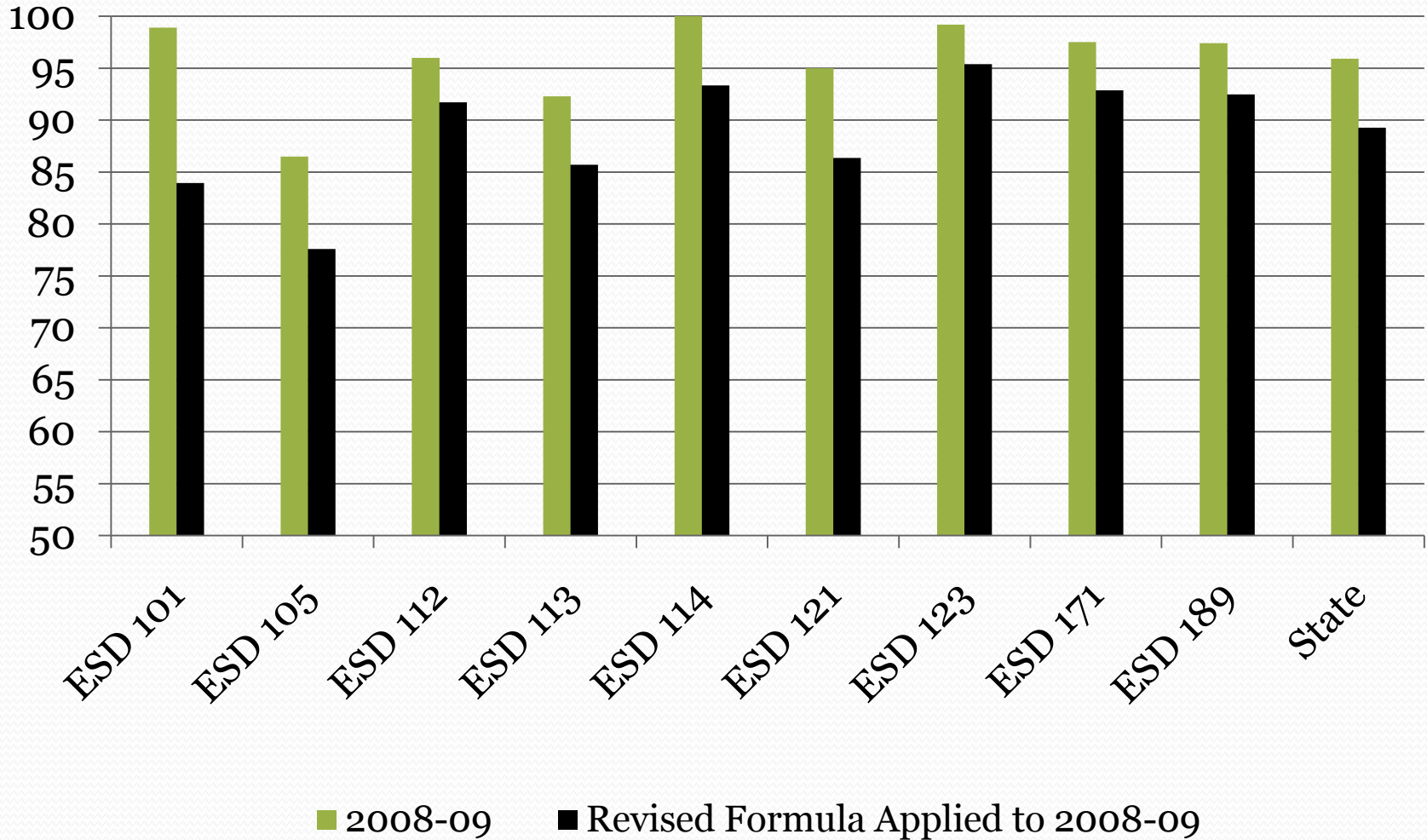
Findings of Non-Compliance

- Districts that are not at 100% compliance on all of the Compliance Indicators are required to correct the non-compliance as soon as possible, but no later than one year from identification, **even if the district is determined to Meet Requirements for that Indicator.** The state's verification and validation of the correction(s) must also take place within this one year period.
- This correction is completed through IDEA Compliance Form Package 442

Summary

- Addition of one new allowable exception to Indicator 12
 - Child was referred to Part C less than 90 days prior to the child's third birthday
- Removal of two current allowable exceptions to Indicator 12
 - Parent and district agreed to extend evaluation timeline (D.2)
 - Transition planning meeting convened by Part C did not occur at least 90 days prior to the child's third birthday (D.5)
- These changes will become effective July 1, 2010
