

## Dear Bridge to College Student:

Congratulations on your upcoming high school graduation! Since you are successfully completing a Bridge to College course during your senior year, you are now eligible for direct placement into college-level courses in math or English at all participating Washington higher education institutions (currently all 34 community and technical colleges plus Eastern Washington University).

**MATH:** To be eligible for automatic college-level placement into Math 107 (Math in Society) or Math 146 (Statistics), you must:

- Complete a Bridge to College course with a second semester grade of B or higher, and
- Enroll in a participating college in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

**ENGLISH:** To be eligible for automatic college-level placement in English 101 (College Composition), you must:

- Complete a Bridge to College course with a grade of B or higher in either semester, and
- Enroll in a participating college in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

To access this direct placement opportunity, be prepared to provide a copy of your high school transcript after you are admitted to one of the participating higher education institutions noted above. If you wish to enroll in a course different from what the agreement allows, please know that you may be required to provide more transcript information or take a placement test.
