### Identification: Numbers to Know

- 2.5% of all students enrolled in U.S. public schools experienced homelessness
- 5.8% of students receiving free lunch experienced homelessness ED*Facts* Data, School Year (SY) 2019-20
- Since SY 2004-05, homelessness has increased an average of 5% annually

## **Additional Measures of Housing Stability**

- WA unemployment for April 2022: 4.1%
- WA unemployment for April 2020: 16.3%
- WA *under*employed rate 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2021 through 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2022: 9.1%

- Out of Reach: <u>https://reports.nlihc.org/oor</u>
  - WA has 7<sup>th</sup> highest housing rate at \$29.31 for 2-bedroom home
  - Would need to work 86 hours per week at minimum wage



#### Identification: Numbers to Know

- All students with an IEP: 14%
  - Homeless children and youth (HCY) with an IEP:19%
  - HCY with an IEP in WA: 21%
- All students who are English learners: 10%
  - HCY who are English learners: 17%
  - HCY who are English learners in WA: 19%
- HCY who are unaccompanied youth: 9%
  - HCY who are unaccompanied youth in WA: 14.5%

  - In reading/language arts: 48
  - In math: 30
- Number of schools where HCY outperform economically disadvantaged students
  - In reading/language arts: 114
  - In math: 71

## Education Data System (EDS)

The <u>Education Data System</u> is a centralized suite of webbased applications regarding educational data. It is used by: state agencies, educational service districts (ESDs), school districts, schools, teachers, teaching certificate applicants, non-profit organizations and businesses for a variety of purposes related to education in the State of Washington. This system is administered by data security managers that assign user roles for each organization and maintained by OSPI.

## CEDARS

The Comprehensive Education Data and Research System (CEDARS) is a longitudinal warehouse of education data. Local Education Agencies (LEA) report data on courses, location, students, and educators.

## Tableau

The Tableau Secure Data Portal (TSDP) is a data analytic and visualization tool available to school and district users to review and analyze student, educator, or finance data.

#### Visualization Types

- 1. Public Reporting Review Tools (Report Card, Federal Reporting, etc.)
- 2. Data Visualizations by Topic (Students Experiencing Homelessness, Alternative Learning Environments, etc.)
