Washington's Waiver Request

Washington state, through OSPI has requested waivers of the ESEA assessment, accountability, and school report card requirements under:

- Section 1111(b)(2)—Assessment requirements
- Section 1111(c)(4) and Section 1111(d)(2)(C)-(D)—Accountability and school identification requirements
- Section 1111(h)—Report card provisions related to certain assessments and accountability

If granted the waivers, the State will not be required to administer its statewide assessments to all students, determine annual accountability determinations, or to provide related data on its State or local report cards for assessment and accountability information.
