8. Program evaluation or evaluation of major findings:

Monies were not able to be spent on the procurement of online interpreter training modules within the original timeline because of challenges to negotiating a final contract within the fiscal year for which funds had been allocated. Possible mitigation against such a delay in the future would be to initiate the procurement process with additional time.

9. Major challenges faced by the program:

The major challenge faced by the program was the lack of sufficient staffing to engage in research in a timelier way on the emerging field of interpreting in the education sector.

10. Future opportunities:

The program can improve through continued funding at previous levels in order to bolster staffing and to further develop resources for districts, as well as to work to establish networks with other entities engaged in similar state-level work on language access.

\$367,000 of the general fund—state appropriation for fiscal year 2023 is provided solely for implementation of Engrossed Second Substitute House Bill No. 1153 (language access in schools).
