Funds provided to contract with the Yakama Nation for a feasibility study to determine the scope, design, planning, and budget for the construction of a new state-tribal compact school.

OSPI contracted with Yakama Nation who, in turn, sub-contracted with the Wenaha Group/BBT Architects to establish a general scope of facility, enrollment and student growth needs for building a new Yakama Nation Tribal School. This feasibility study is available upon request from the OSPI Office of Native Education.
