Career/College Readiness

- 1. Purpose: This proviso supports the increase of career and college readiness of public school students through the establishment of the Work-Integrated Learning Advisory Committee (WILAC). OSPI, in consultation with the Employment Security Department (ESD) and the Workforce Training and Education Coordinating Board, must convene a work-integrated learning advisory committee to provide advice to the legislature and education and workforce sectors on creating opportunities for students to engage in work-integrated learning.
- 2. Description of services provided: As described in the originating legislation, The WILAC must make recommendations for students to explore and understand a wide range of career-related opportunities through applied learning; engage with industry mentors; and plan for career and college success. Work-Integrated learning includes but is not limited to early, frequent, and systemic learning experiences that are essential for preparing Washington youth for high-demand, family-wage jobs in Washington state, and that engage students in grades five through twelve or through high school dropout reengagement plans. These funds provide committee support for administration and management of the WILAC.
- 3. Criteria for receiving services and/or grants: The task of the WILAC are outlined in legislation, as is the required minimum representation of the committee. The committee must include one member from each caucus of the senate, and from each caucus of the house of representatives, the superintendent of public instruction or designee, an educator representing K-12 CTE, a school counselor, an educator representing the community and technical colleges, a member of the governor's office specializing in CTE and workforce, a member representing the workforce training and education coordinating board, and subcommittee members as identified and recommended by the committee.
