State ESEA Plan	Jason Miller Notice to school districts and community members of the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction's intent to submit an addendum to Washington's Consolidated State Plan pursuant to Section 8401 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). OSPI will submit an addendum to ED to request short-term, minimal modifications to the state accountability system as defined in Washington's Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Consolidated Plan. Changes proposed in the addendum are temporary, one-year changes necessitated by data gaps in school years 2019–20 and 2020–21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The public comment period opens Monday, February 28, and will close at 11:59 pm on Thursday, March 3. Comments may be submitted through OSPI's public comment survey.
