WCAS Field Test Rangefinding Work Group

Purpose: Decide how every student short-answer response will be scored. The scoring rubrics, anchor papers with annotations, and practice papers with annotations are reviewed, revised, and approved.

Meeting Specifications: Three (3) to four (4) short-answer response sets are reviewed per day.

Work Group Roles:

Educators

- Provide classroom and grade-level expertise
- Review and accepts the annotations for each anchor and practice paper
- Approve final rubrics that determine how all responses to the reviewed items will be scored
- Maintain confidentiality of test material and student responses

OSPI and Vendor

- Provide training on item cluster development
- Facilitate discussions and decision-making regarding annotations and student responses
- Ensure modifications to annotations and rubrics are accurately recorded
- Ensure scoring materials support validity and reliability of WCAS
- Ensure quality and consistency of products

Process: For each cluster and standalone item:

- 1. OSPI reads the stimulus and item aloud to the workgroup.
- 2. Individually write out a response to the item.
- 3. Collectively read the scoring rubric.
- 4. Score the response using the scoring rubric.
- 5. As a group, discuss the rubric and note revisions.
- 6. Review the anchor papers one at a time and revise the rubric as needed.
- 7. Review revised rubric, assuring all scoring decisions from the anchor papers are captured in the annotations.
- 8. Individually score all the practice papers using the revised rubric and the anchor papers.
- 9. Review the practices one at a time and revise rubric as needed.
- 10. Review final rubric to ensure all scoring decisions are captured.
- 11. Review final annotations for approval.
