This is a comparison chart between the various meal service options in Washington State offered within the National School Lunch (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP). Options include standard NSLP/SBP operations, <u>House Bill (HB) 1238</u>, the <u>Community Eligibility Provision</u> (CEP), and <u>Provision 2</u>. Multiple meal service options may be implemented within the same Local Education Agency (LEA) – please ensure schools operate in compliance with the meal service option implemented at the site.
