  - o 2022-23 Summit Report link
- Governor's Operating Budget Anna Marie Dufault
  - Increasing the special education funding cap to 17.25%
  - Making progress on OSPI's proposal to establish a living wage for our 32,000 paraeducators by increasing the state's allocation.
  - Fully funding OSPI's proposal to establish a special education teacher residency program, which would add 45 additional endorsed special education teachers to our workforce each year.
  - Advancing our regional mental and behavioral health work being led by the ESDs
  - Fully funding OSPI's request to fully fund the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)
  - Investing in OSPI's request to invest in the College Success Foundation's Rally for College initiative
  - Making an additional investment in our state's ClimeTime work
  - Doubling OSPI's request for clean classroom air
  - Making progress on OSPI's request to enhance the School Construction Assistance Program (SCAP)
  - o Fully funding OSPI's request for the Small District Modernization Program



## Mental Health regarding Hispanic/Latino/Students

- 11 Commissioners, 8 staff
- Created in 1971
- Community Development Officers (5)
- Identify, Advise, Advise, Establish
- Latinos in WA are younger than the average Washingtonian
- Barriers to Mental Health Care
  - Lack of Cultural Competence
  - Legal status
  - Language barriers
  - o Poverty, less health insurance coverage
  - Stigma
- Studies found increased depression and anxiety in Latino communities during the Pandemic
- Half of Hispanic adolescent females reported feeling sad or hopeless in 2019 –
   23% considered suicide
- Rates of youth mental health problems are on the rise
- Action Based Recommendations
  - Telemedicine
  - Increase access to CBT

- Migrant Student Eligibility
  - o 3-21 years of age
  - School completion
  - Move
  - Across District boundaries
  - o Time
- Washington state has the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest # of migrant students
  - 30,200 Migrant students
- Migrant Student Health
  - One of the most underserved & poorest groups in the US
  - o 300,000-500,000 children under 18
  - o Higher probability of school failure, dropout, retention
- Need for Supplemental
  - Expansion of requirements



- School nursing services aren't equitable across state
- Chronic health conditions have increased by 328% in WA
- Nursing services have been reduced
- Services must:
  - Help children to participate
  - Not be ongoing or long-term
  - Costs remain necessary, reasonable and allocable to the MEP
- WA State MEP Supplemental Health Goals
- Migrant Nurse Case Management Model
  - Sister model of School Nurse Core
    - Direct RN services
    - Coordinated case management
    - Student advocacy
    - Improve academic achievement
    - Decrease absenteeism
- School Nurse vs. Nurse Case Manager
  - School nurse = all students, but not always available
  - Scope defined flexibility (home visits, health education, parent engagement, health and social service advocacy)
- Methods/Tools
  - 1:1 interview with student
  - Family/Home visit
    - Assess needs, strengths
    - Discuss options
    - Develop a plan
- Migrant Nurse Case Manager Initiative
  - Bilingual position
  - One fiscal agent
  - Time proportional to total migrant student
  - Provide support in school (MOU)
  - Supervision guided by district evaluation
- Migrant Health Nurse Initiative
- Highest Reported Needs
  - Mental health
  - Vision referrals
  - Immunization compliance
  - COVID-19 resources
- Response to Mental Health Needs
  - Project AWARE
- Behavioral Health Grant Opportunity 2023-2024



- Up to \$50k/grant
- Migrant Behavioral Health Therapist
- Behavioral Health Services
  - Aims to prevent students from disengaging

# **Opioid Overdose Response in Washington Schools.**

- RCW 28A.210.390
  - Requires school districts with 2000 students or more to keep Naloxone on hand
- Data Collection
  - Doses administered 7 fold increase last year from previous year
  - o Identified Needs
    - Training
    - Cost
    - Difficulty Obtaining
- What Next?
  - DOH 2 kits to every High School
  - More supports for obtaining stock
  - Gov. Inslee legislation for education re: fentanyl
  - SB 5804 filed would require naloxone in every High School
