

Online Learning Approvals: 2020-2021

Goals:

To support schools temporarily utilizing online learning elements during the Coronavirus crisis and as a long term option for students, and to clarify online learning approval requirements.

Approvals

Schools adapting to continuous remote learning and hybrid models will likely be doing this largely through elements of online learning.

Online learning has specific definitions and requirements in state statute, including a requirement for OSPI approval. Schools and school districts should be aware of these requirements. One of the requirements is an approval through OSPI.

To support schools to meet these requirements OSPI has developed a decision tree to help districts identify if they need approval during the pandemic.

1. If your district does not have an approval in place, **please see the following decision tree to determine if you will need one.**
2. Reassess your plans regularly. While many of these continuous remote learning and hybrid approaches will cease once students are allowed to return to the regular classroom, you may discover that many of your families and students will continue

to find value in—or need for—an ongoing online learning program.
