PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

This bulletin provides school districts with current information about the three funded professional learning days as a result of <u>RCW 28A.150.415</u>, and the areas of focus for one day each year as described in <u>RCW 28A.415.445</u> and in Senate Bill 5044 (2021). These professional learning days must be designed using the Professional Learning standards as per <u>RCW 28A.415.430</u>.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

Beginning in 2020, there are three funded professional learning days (<u>RCW 28A.150.415</u>). One of the three days each year has a specific area of focus. The focus area alternates between content described in <u>RCW 28A.415.445</u> which is social emotional learning focused, and content described in Senate Bill 5044 (2021) which is focused on cultural competency, diversity, equity, and inclusion professional learning for educators and staff.

 Beginning in 2020–21, one of the three days must be devoted to Social Emotional Learning (SEL) topics (<u>RCW 28A.415.445</u>). The other two days do not have a statedirected topic and professional learning focus on these days can be determined locally. From the 2020–21 school year forward, "every other year" there is a stateprovided professional learning day devoted to SEL. The next SEL school year is 2022–23.

- With the passage of Senate Bill 5044, beginning in the 2021–22 and every other year forward, districts must provide one professional learning day on Cultural Competency Diversity Equity and Inclusion (CCDEI) training. The next CCDEI year is 2023–24.
- The focus of the state-directed day alternates between SEL and CCDEI. Each year, two of the professional learning days do not have state-directed topics and the professional learning focus can be determined locally.
- Beginning in 2023–24 (CCDEI year), the CCDEI training must be aligned with new CCDEI standards which will be developed by the Professional Educators Standards Board.
