**Purpose:** RCW 70.24.290 was amended (HB1551, 2020) and directed OSPI to adopt rules concerning educating and training school employees on the prevention, transmission, and treatment of blood-borne pathogens. Previously, the requirement was for education and training concerning HIV/AIDS but has been amended to include blood-borne pathogens. The rule making amends chapter 392-198 WAC to modernize the rule language and de-stigmatize HIV/AIDS by updating school employee training and education for blood-borne pathogens. A more generalized approach to training staff concerning blood-borne pathogens is necessary for effective prevention of potential disease transmission.
