Purpose: Engrossed Second Substitute Senate Bill 6362 (2018) added a new section to chapter 28A.300 RCW. The changes go into effect for the 2018-19 school year. New language added to the statute addresses requirements that districts follow criteria specified in the law when identifying students for Highly Capable services. The Superintendent of Public Instruction is directed to require districts to follow these criteria and to disseminate guidance that is updated and aligned with evidence-based practices. This rule making aligns the rules with the statutory changes.
