**Purpose:** The rule making order repeals chapter 392-330 WAC – State Magnet School Program, which was adopted in 1993 to implement a grant program authorized in the operating budget during the 1993-1995 biennium. The magnet school projects funding proviso and OSPI's authority to promulgate rules related to the grants were discontinued in the 1995-97 operating budget and have not been renewed. Because the statutory authority on which the rule is based has been repealed and the rule is no longer necessary, OSPI is repealing chapter 392-330 WAC through expedited rule making.
